

Remarks Onboard Friday Sept 24th 1847

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from North accompanied with passing squalls of fog and rollers steering S. by E. under short sail at dusk took in fore top sail & the main running under fore sail & main top sail

Middle part comes on strong breeze from S. by E. at dawn have the heading S. E. & furled fore sail at daylight squalls sent down main top gallant yard at 4 P.M. bore up S. E. until 11 P.M. have the heading S. by E. blows strong gale

Ends with tremendous gales & violent squalls from N.W. by W.

Long per. chm. 10-20 M. Lat by B. 39-37 S.

Remarks Onboard Saturday Sept 25th 1847

These 24 hours begins with violent gales from N.W. accompanied with tremendous squalls & a large sea ship laying too heading N.W. by W. at 3 A.M. took in W. & set bristled & turned up & lost 20 ducks were ship heading S.W. by E.

Middle part the same laying too at 9 A.M. took in weather clew of main top sail at fore & stern

Later part the same at daylight set main top sail Ends with violent gales

Long per. chm. 10-00 M. Lat by B. 39-25 S.

Remarks Onboard Sunday Sept 26th 1847

These 24 hours begins with violent gales from N.W. & passing squalls of rain & hail with a tremendous sea running laying too heading to the S. by E. at dusk took in weather clew of main top sail

Middle part the same carried away half in and it till put on tables on the rollers

Ends the same ship takes some water on board

Long per. chm. 10-00 M. Lat by B. 38-43 S.

Remarks Onboard Monday Sept 27th 1847

These 24 hours begins with gales from N.W. by W. laying too heading S. by E. at 2 A.M. moderates some at dusk set house & spinnies

Middle part moderates winds blew to S.W. at daylight hoisted fore sail

Later part fresh breezes at 1 P.M. set the top sails bore up S. E. & large sea running

Long per. chm. 9-40

Lat by B. 37-44 North

Remarks Onboard Tuesday Sept 28th 1847

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from N.W. with passing squalls steering N. E. & all present sail set employed putting up water. Boats to hoist up. Saw fin backs sent up main top gallant yard - set sail

Middle part more moderate

Later part light airs & calm at 6 A.M. hauled up East made all sail caught a sun fish employed at various jobs this day like the rest no fish.

Long 8-20 M.

Lat by B. 36-30 N.

Remarks Onboard Wednesday Sept 29th 1847

These 24 hours begins with light airs & calm ship heading Eastward. at dusk light airs from N. E. took in top gallant sail & fly jib

Middle part fine breeze blew down the top sails at day light made all sail bore up S. E.

Later part fine weather saw nothing
