

Remarks Onboard Monday Oct 18th 1847

Commenced with fresh breeze from S.W. & clear weather ^{single} kept the topsail ship heading East on 2 wind not 6' canar Burpation variation 2 1/4 from N. W. by E.

Middle part wind more to East at 9 A.M. were ship heading South close reef the topsail

Letter part show breeze at day light set main sail & jib and 2 ship heading to the S.W.

Long 27 1/2

Lat 38 1/2 N. Br. 38 1/2

Remarks Onboard Tuesday Oct 19th 1847

Commenced with strong breeze from East with rain saw several pinbacks & ship in sight on our lee quarter at dusk rainy ship heading S.W.

Middle part strong breeze & severe rain at 2 P.M. took in jib main sail & foretopmast headsail at day light winds hauled to E. put ship's head E. Letter part strong wind & passing squalls from South in warning ship this morning carried away shrouds of main yard refitted them set double reef & main sail at 7 P.M. at 1 P.M. close reef the topsail & violent sea running from N.E. ship heading S.W.

Remarks Onboard Wednesday Oct 20th 1847

Commenced with violent breezes from North & strong squalls with passing clouds ship heading S.W. under close reef topsail courses & foremast violent sea running from N.E. at 6 A.M. saw 2 sail on our lee bow heading to E. Mr. Snider unwell below copper sick below Middle part the same at 3 P.M. moderates shook out 2 reef out the topsail set jib & main. 1st gallant sail saw 2 ship to leeward under short sail at 4 P.M. broke out 2 bells front & weather

Ends with moderate breezes & heavy swell shook out all the reef

Remarks Onboard Thursday Oct 21st 1847

Commenced with moderate breezes from S.W. & clear weather at 1 P.M. made all sail steering N.E. by E. & saw a ship on the weather quarter commencing up with us on our lee quarter

Middle part light air from N.W. at 3 P.M. winds head to N.W. & steering N.E. by E.

Letter part moderate breezes from N.W. at day light saw a large ship when commencing up with us saw another to the North of us weather fine & pleasant employed hauling out main hatch & starting black fish at 10 P.M. & on the 21st

Long per chron 32 27 East Lat 38 26 South

Remarks Onboard Friday Oct 22nd 1847

Commenced with moderate breezes from N.W. & pleasant steering N.E. by E. all sail set at 4 A.M. spoke ship Lord Langford of London bound to Bengal in India 18 days out Lat 38 26 Long 32 27 & steering N.E. by E.

Middle part the same at 2 P.M. winds head to N.W. fresh breeze increasing at daylight strong winds with heavy squalls

Letter part letter part very strong breeze carrying a press of sail steering N.E. by E. saw 2 ship steering the same & commencing up with us Copper much better & 2nd mate

Long per chron 36 02 East Lat 38 21

Remarks Onboard Saturday Oct 22nd 1847

Commenced with strong breezes from N.W. & passing squalls &c. carrying a press of sail steering N.E. by E. at 3 A.M. exchanged colors with an English ship steering N.E. by E. at dusk squally

Middle part severe squalls with rain

Letter part More moderate winds hauling to N.W. Ends with light breezes saw pinbacks copper getting better Mr. Snider keeping watch

Long per chron 39 30 E Lat 38 10 N
