Remarks Onboard Thursday Jan 6th 1848
Commenced with strong gales from S.W. laying too
heading S.E. clear with passing squalls at 6 P.M. took
in main topsail
Middle part violent gales from W.N.W. took in ^{stowed} main

Latter part more moderate at 11 P.M. set main topsail
& fore sail were ship heading S.W. tremendous sea
running from West.

Long per chron 6:14 East Lat by Bs 46 42 South

Remarks Onboard Friday Jan 7th 1848
Commenced with strong gales from West ship heading
to S.W. have seen nothing hear & have no hopes of
seeing anything like a Right whale

Middle part the same

Latter part light up cleared off S.W. 3 hours
Eerie with thick fog & wind from South

Long 69:31 East Lat 47 24 South

Remarks Onboard Saturday Jan 8th 1848
Commenced with strong gales from S.W. accompanied with thick
fog laying too heading S.E.

Middle part strong gales at daylight wind hauled to
N.W.

Latter part the same at 8 A.M. hauled ship heading
S.W. set fore sail

Remarks Onboard Sunday Jan 9th 1848
Commenced with strong gales from N.W. ship heading
S.W. laying too mostly clear with passing squalls

Middle & latter part the same at daylight set close
reef fore topsail at 11 P.M. hauled ship heading S.W.
Cooper getting better fast

Long per chron 70:40 East Lat by Bs 47 51 South

gave molasses this morning

Remarks Onboard Monday Jan 10th 1848
Commenced with fresh gales & passing squalls with sun shine
more off S.W. & then hauled our wind heading S.E. shot
our reef out the topsails at dusk took in sail heading S.W.
at daylight made sail at 7 A.M. bore up S.E. for
St. Pauls with the wind N. set single reef topsails
