

Remarks On Board Tuesday February 8th 1848

Commenced with calm pleasant employment at various jobs Middle & latter part the same broke out meet & better Ends with light air from N.W. course N.E. lower for compass
Long 16.31 East Lat 31.44 N

Remarks On Board Wednesday Feb 9th 1848

Commenced with light air from N.W. pleasant course N.E. people employed mending clothes on rigging saw & shales Middle & latter part fresh breezes from West to N.W. steering N.E. by E employed at various jobs

Copper getting some better shaly
Long for chain 18.30 East Lat 32.03

Remarks On Board Thursday Feb 11th 1848

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. steering N.E. by E. all present sail set saw nothing Middle & latter part fresh breezes from N.W. to S.W. clear without main sail repairing it thus Ends

Long 110.30 E Lat 32.35

Remarks On Board Friday Feb 11th 1848

Commenced with fresh breezes from S.W. pleasant course E. by E. all sail set employed repairing main sail finished & sent it Middle & latter part the same same propellers - Ends more moderate. Sailed long and the ship

Long 113.45 Lat 33.29

Remarks On Board Saturday Feb 12th 1848

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. steering East fine weather put aboard on shipboard anchor the all present sail set Middle & latter part fine breezes from South ship heading E. by E. by the wind at 11 P.M. made the land. Cape St. Vincent the South Entrance of George's Bay bearing East for compass Dist 30 miles at Noon

Copper getting better part

Lat of ship by Obs 33.29 N

Remarks On Board Sunday Feb 13th 1848

Commenced with fresh breezes from South with clear sky at 10 AM took in the gal sails by job xing & reef the spreads 50 & hauled up chains then got the anchor off the bow passed Capt. Sturges' Enchanted conch with Jan. American ship bound out. at 12 noon ship heading off the Bay came to anchor at 9 AM in 5 fathoms water 45 fathoms chain out 2 ships near as middle part & latter part fine weather thus Ends
Lying at anchor all little came on board

Remarks On Board Monday 14th

Commenced fine port on shore to see the weathering place middle & latter part wind around the compass employed working & putting took off one rope of 60 lbs of 60 through set watch for the night

Remarks On Board Tuesday Feb 15th 1848

Commenced with fine weather gold Hunter & Congress got under weigh & went up the Bay took off one rope of water one load of wood stored it below took an amount of water found 360 lbs in all thus Ends set watch for the night

Remarks On Board Wednesday Feb 16th 1848

Commenced with fine weather ends the same finished getting off wood & water took 1 load of wood 818 lbs of water

Remarks On Board Thursday Feb 17th 1848 Commenced fine wind from South Middle part the same at 1 PM got under weigh with the wind from South went 10 miles further up the Bay brot up at the top in 4 fathoms of water 45 fathoms chain out 2 ships near as middle part & latter part fine weather thus Ends
Hunter in company

Remarks On Board Friday Feb 18th 1848

Commenced with fine weather wind off the land ends the same I board watch shore on liberty all but the Carpenter come off at sunset

Remarks On Board Saturday Feb 19th 1848

Commenced with fine weather wind off shore ends the same the board watch shore on liberty come off all but 4 Ely. Panton Nathan Whitley William Mc Knight John Speakman Capt and one Boats crew got up the Bay for potatoes Returned at 10 PM with 11.20 of potatoes
