

Remarks On Board Friday, Feb. 24th 1848

Commenced with fine weather after dinner saw
D. Sherman whale shoot for him. Saw several others
during the afternoon at sunset S. Board struck one
at 8 P.M. got him along side made fast took in
sail set quarter cock. Middle part fine weather
at daylight commenced to cut finished getting off. heell
& eat badly at rain good whale nothing in sight

Remarks On Board Saturday Feb. 25th 1848

Commenced with fine weather light airs from S.E. employed
tacking in junk & Bailing case finished got supper set watch
started work ship heading N.W. middle & latter part fine
at daylight made sail saw ship Gold Hunter at 7 P.M. put ship
head to South finished Bailing. heell. So Ends Lat 27 46 Long 108 45

Remarks On Board Sunday Feb. 26th 1848

Commenced with fine weather employed bailing ship head
N.W. at dusk took in sail middle part the same
latter part fresh breezes from V.E. ship heading East
saw nothing. So Ends bailing
Long 108 16 East Lat by Obs 28 00

Remarks On Board Monday Feb. 27th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from V.E. clear double reef
the topsails ship heading E.S.E. finished bailing at 4 P.M.
turned up 6 S. sails middle part the same at daylight
Commenced breaking out main hatch to stow coams latter
part more moderate Long 108 46 E. Lat 27 37

Remarks On Board Tuesday Feb. 28th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from V.E. ship heading E.S.E.
employed stowing down finished at 4 P.M. put down 6 S. sails
took in sail set watch middle & latter part fine weather
ship heading S.E. under all sail So Ends
took dinner Obs blacksmith at work
Long 109 42 Lat 27 30

Remarks On Board Wednesday Feb. 29th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from V.E. at 2 P.M. double reef the
topsails ship heading S.E. at dusk took in sail middle & latter
part the same evening under short sail blacksmith at work
So Ends Long 109 34 East Lat by Obs 27 46 V

Remarks On Board Thursday Feb. 30th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from V.E. clear ship head V.M. saw
no whale at dusk took in sail wore ship heading E middle & latter
part the same at daylight set fore sail at 1 P.M. took it in two
ragged to a hulk it saw ship Gold Hunter to seaward
Ends with moderate gales & passing squalls.
Long 110 12 East Lat 27 48

Remarks On Board Friday Feb. 31st 1848

Commenced with moderate gales & passing squalls from V.E. clear
ship laying too heading V.M. sail to seaward middle & latter
part the same laying too so Ends Long 111 24 Lat 27 47 V

Remarks On Board Saturday April 1st 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from V.E. clear at double reef
topsails heading V.M. at 2 P.M. spoke the bark Pharo of S. New
Bedford Whiston Master at dusk took in sail
middle & latter part more moderate at daylight
made sail heading East one ship in sight
For 108 40 fore sail Lat 28 00

Remarks On Board Sunday April 2nd 1848

Commenced with fresh breezes from V.E. ship head
E.S. at dusk spoke ship Iris Weeks master middle
part the same at daylight set all sail fine weather
heading E.S. by the wind Iris in company Long 109 Lat 27 41

Remarks On Board Monday April 3rd 1848

Commenced with fine weather all sail at heading East at 1 P.M.
spoke ship Susan of New Bedford 35 months out 1900 lbs at dusk took
in sail & in sight middle & latter part fine weather blacksmith
at work Berke out water & coal sent up royal master
fore & aft
