

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 7th 1848

Fine weather first & middle part 2 Boats went for oysters killed 6 pic had a visit of sailors (other part of party) winds on the sand one hunger for him to do business capt went on a cruise to Enes Employed sitting head stage

Remarks On Board Thursday June 8th 1848

Commenced with strong South wind with clouds & rain squalls struck royal masts & fore top, calm most middle part the same latter part fresh breezes Boats off chasing whales got nothing No Ends

Remarks On Board ~~Friday~~ ^{Saturday} June 9th 1848

Begins with fresh breezes from N.E. clear Boats on board people employed sitting up Rigging middle part the same latter part strong breezes Boats went off at daylight returned at 10 o'clock clear to strong for them to Enes

Remarks On Board ~~Saturday~~ ^{Sunday} June 10th

Begins with strong breezes from N.E. clear all hands on board - 2 Bark came to anchor 6 miles to N.W. of us at dusk winds light middle part the same latter part strong breezes 3 Boats off chasing with no success Bark Ark came in 10 miles off. 5 mile to East of us

Remarks On Board Sunday June 11th 1848

Begins with fine weather Boats came on board at 4 M. saw 20 whales middle part the same latter part strong breezes & Boats on down to Enes -

Remarks On Board Monday June 12th 1848

Begins with fine weather saw 20 whales middle & latter part fine weather employed repairing forecast Boats on shore

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 13th 1848

Begins with fine weather 20 whales in sight employed repairing fore sail Enes the same saw 20 whales employed repairing forecast & sitting fore yard No Ends

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 14th 1848

Begins with fine weather employed repairing main topsail middle part the light air from N.E. at daylight breezes from N.W. at 8 PM had a severe squall of rain & wind from N.W. Enes with strong N.W. wind & cloudy weather saw 20 whales

one native stopped on Board last night

Remarks On Board Thursday June 15th 1848

Begins with strong breezes from N.W. & clear people employed at repairing main topsail at dusk moderate middle & latter part the same got 200 pounds of Bred from the Bark Ark. so Enes -

Remarks On Board Friday June 16th 1848

Begins with fine weather & clear, 1 by one Boat off on Deuce got down off the middle part same latter part strong breezes & equally capt went around the Island saw 2 place to get land - so Enes?

Remarks On Board Saturday June 17th 1848

Begins with strong breezes from South clear with rain middle & latter part clear with fresh breezes saw 20 whales one boat after battle

Remarks On Board Sunday June 18th 1848

Begins with fresh breezes & clear caught one bottle about 2 PM middle & latter part moderate & cloudy at sunrise saw one humpback Boats chased him to N.W. so Enes with severe rain caught 20 whales

Remarks On Board Monday June 19th 1848

Commenced with moderate breezes & cloudy middle & latter part light rain squalls No Ends

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 20th 1848
Begins with moderate breezes from off shore with light rain showers middle & latter part fresh saw 20 whales No Ends

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 21st 1848

Begins with strong breezes & cloudy at dusk saw 20 humpbacks coming with the Bay middle & latter part strong breezes saw nothing No Ends

Remarks On Board Thursday June 22nd 1848

Begins with strong winds & clear saw 20 spots along distance off shore middle & latter part the same saw 20 whales No Ends

Remarks On Board Friday June 23rd 1848

Begins with strong winds from E. clear weather still laying at anchor doing nothing draft in company at dusk moderate middle part the latter part more moderate saw 20 whales got some meat of the
