

Remarks On Board Tuesday Sept 26th 1848

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. & hawling to the N.E. with fog & rain at 2 P.M. kept the topsails hoisted to N.E. both in fore & main close reef main & other boats have the heeling to E. at dusk set spencers masted up to the mast
Barometer still at 29.4 middle part of day from N.W. at 3 P.M. here up at 8 P.M. at dusk light set but topsails only. Midship wind E. & blowing strong

Remarks On Board Wednesday Sept 27th Long 147° 10' E. Lat 44° 44' N

Commenced with fine breezes from N.W. & passing clouds clearing & by 11 AM saw fine backs at dusk double reefed the topsails. Barometer commenced rising this morning. Standers at 29.4 middle part here led on a wind to E. at 11 about ship head to S.W. at day light stood to S.W. made all previous sail wind & blowing strong at 9 P.M. saw Passions head bearing W. distance 15 miles. Took home reef out the topsails at noon head bore N.W. by S. 7 Dist Lat 44° 33' 38" Long 147° 33' E

Remarks On Board Thursday Sept 28th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from E. & S. & squally made all sail tearing & in N.E. at 2 P.M. & W. at 4 AM. and then got anchors off at 5 P.M. & Pilot for Robert Town at 7 P.M. cannot anchor at home 11 fathoms water 45 fathoms chain out. Sailed sails masted & letter port masted & letter port fine weather employed in getting ready for water & recruits so ends

Remarks On Board Friday Sept 29th 1848

Commenced with fine weather employed setting up pipes & blacksmithing & some slight light rain ends the same

Remarks On Board Sept 30th 1848

Remarks Throught these 24 hours fine weather employed getting in board 35 sacks Flour 24 sacks stowed below. So ends several arrivals

Remarks On Board Sunday October 1st 1848

Commenced with fine weather people on shore all but 4 came off at dusk Wallace went ashore

Remarks On Board Monday Oct 2nd 1848

Fine weather employed breaking out oil to go ashore took out 8 casks 3 of heads as follows 1 cask of Blackick oil

Tuesday Oct 3rd 1848

Fine weather people employed taking oil on shore sent on shore 23 casks an American Barge came in today the Franklyn of Sydney bore 16 miles & was like this ends

Remarks On Board Oct 4th 1848

Fine weather employed getting off Bread & sending other articles took on board 99 bags of Bread to day & stowed it below

Remarks On Board Oct 5th 1848

Fine weather employed getting off with 9 Bread & flour finished stowing off fore & main masts put down 11 pipes Bread & 15 shot ends

Remarks On Board Friday Oct 6th 1848

Fine weather all hands employed taking on board provisions took in 3 tons potatoes so ends discharged the Steward

Remarks On Board Saturday Oct 7th 1848

Throught these 24 hours fine weather & under all sails going & commencing took on board 55 tiers of Beef & 8 bbls Pork & 2 Hogs Pans 1 Blk 1 white

Remarks On Board Sunday Oct 8th 1848

Throught these 24 hours fine weather people on shore on liberty at sunset aboard watch came on board. Steward watch stayed ashore for the night so ends

Remarks On Board Monday Oct 9th 1848

Began with fine weather all hands on board but El. Fox & 2 others & Nathan & William M. Knight did not come on board this morning

Remarks On Board Tuesday Oct 10th 1848

Throught these 24 hours fine weather aboard watch ashore on liberty 2 men came on board & joined the ship liberty men came on board at dusk

Remarks On Board Wednesday Oct 11th 1848

Commenced with fine weather middle part showing Steward watch on shore on liberty took on board 1 ton of Bread & several other articles -

Remarks On Board Thursday Oct 12th 1848

Commenced with fine weather took on board 25 sacks of Bread & 5 sacks Flour M. Molasses stowed them below & watch ashore came on board at dusk

Remarks On Board Friday Oct 13th 1848

Commenced with strong weather Steward watch ashore on liberty all came on board so ends
