

Remarks On Board Tuesday Nov. 7th 1848

Commenced with moderate gales from S.W. put ship's head to S.E. at 10 AM light to heading to W. calm in main topsail. Weather variable clearing to the S. then saw 2 seals & one whale so Ends Log 154.20 Lat 37.10

Remarks On Board Wednesday Nov. 8th 1848

Commenced with fine weather steering to S. saw 1 large whale at dusk spoke the Bark Panther of New Bedford 43 months old 19.11.1848 middle & latter part winds S. thick employed at various jobs saw 2 whale lowered for him without success

Lat 38.05 Long 154.27

Remarks On Board Thursday Nov. 9th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from S.E. steering W.E. saw 1 whale lowered for him without success at dusk took in sail close reefed main topsail heading to E. helped the men get off the fore-castle to pump ship with 2 pumps and middle & latter part fresh gales from S. ran off to W. within light too head to Westward Panther in sight

Lat 38.10 Long 154.25

Remarks On Board Friday Nov. 10th 1848

Commenced with fresh gales from S.E. laying too head to S.W. at 2 PM wind hauled to S.W. and S. moderate with rain middle & latter part fine weather saw whale chased them to Ends

Lat 37.45 Long 154.15

Remarks On Board Saturday Nov. 11th 1848

Commenced with calm Panther in company kept close on board watch employed Punching down 16 Bundles at dusk took in sail steering to E. with light breezes from S. middle & latter part strong breezes from S. thick employed chasing Night whales so Ends Log 154.54 Lat 38.17

Remarks On Board Sunday Nov. 12th 1848

Commenced with strong southerly wind & thick weather employed chasing whales at dusk took in sail head to W. at 7 o'clock wind shifted to S.W. with violent gale accompanied lightning middle & latter part the same laying too head to W. in main topsail in ends heading to

Lat 38.01

Long 154.45

Remarks On Board Monday Nov. 13th 1848

Commenced with violent gales from W. accompanied with squalls of hail at 1 PM set main topsail heading to W. at dusk took in main ship heading to W. middle part violent squalls latter part more moderate

Long 152.46 Lat 37.40

Remarks On Board Tuesday Nov. 14th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from W. laying too heading to S.E. at dusk hauled a whale lowered for him to 10 fathoms middle & latter part light air & calm saw 2 porbeag. watch employed picking over potatoes to Ends

Long per chron. 152.40 Lat 37.46

Remarks On Board Wednesday Nov. 15th 1848

Commenced with fresh breezes from S.E. clear saw several whales lowered for them 2 boats sent out one Boatswain missed and great number fin backs at dusk took in sail steering W. middle part heavy two heading E. at daylight took ship head N.W. rain W. blowing a gale from S.E. so Ends Lat 38.22 Long 153.10

Remarks On Board Thursday Nov. 16th 1848

Commenced with strong gales from S.E. laying too head to S.W. took in main topsail at dusk hauled ship head to E. middle part moderate at 7 PM steered to W. at close reefed main topsail Ends more moderate but a heavy rain running from S. so 20 fin backs

Long per chron. 152.35 Lat 38.52

Remarks On Board Friday Nov. 17th 1848

Begins with a sudden shift of wind from S. to W. with squalls & rain took in main topsail at dusk hauled ship heading to S. W. under fore main & fore middle part & latter part the same so Ends

Long 153.05 Lat 38.42

Remarks On Board Saturday Nov. 18th 1848

Begins with violent gale from W. laying too head to S. W. at 1 PM ship to seaward at 4 PM took in Bow Boat middle part & latter part the same at 7 PM veered ship heading to W. W. broke out weather

Lat 38.28 Long 153.40
