Commenced with moderate breeze from E. & passing squalls of rain steering N. by E. one sail in sight middle & latter part the same people employed at various jobs one sail in sight

Remarks On Board Thursday Feb 15th 1849

Commenced with moderate breeze from N. E. ship heading to S. W. at dusk spoke ship Alabama of Kentucky 33 months out 1300 spm. middle & latter part the same at 10th tacked to E.

Remarks On Board Friday Feb 16th 1849

Commenced with light air from N. heading to E. gambled with Alabama saw Blackfish chased to 20 fathoms middle & latter part the same watches employed cleaning ironwork

Remarks On Board Saturday Feb 17th

& Commenced with fair weather wind N. E. at 4 P.M. about ship heading to N. Alabama in company middle & latter part wind more to N. & headed to E. at daylight employed working chains broke out water

Remarks On Board Sunday Feb 18th 1849

Commenced with fine weather wind N. W. ship heading by the wind to N. E. middle part mackerel hauled to the surface latter part rain & thick wind N. E. saw a sail in the N. E. course

Remarks On Board Monday Feb 19th 1849

Commenced with fresh breeze from N. E. with passing rain squalls steering N. E. middle part rain latter part light & baffling employed the getting fore topmast steering sail gear ready

Remarks On Board Tuesday Feb 20th 1849

Commenced with light breeze from N. E. course and all sail set fore topmast steering sail middle & latter part light breeze from East to E. ship heading to N. by the wind

Commenced with light baffling air from N. E. ship heading S. W. middle part rain latter part light air from N. W. some rain broke out must Riel & other small stores 20 P.M.

Remarks On Board Thursday Feb 22nd 1849

Commenced with light breeze from N. W. after dinner saw a large sperm whale leaped for him Bow Boat went on missed him chased until 4 P.M. to 20 fathoms middle part light air & calm

Remarks On Board Friday Feb 23rd 1849

Commenced with calm at 4 P.M. moderate breeze from N. E. set S. T. 1 sail middle part moderate breeze from E. & E. course N. W. by latter part baffling course N. W. at 10 A.M. saw Hesper's Islands head West per compass Variation 11 Degrees East by judge them to be 25 miles distant hauled up N. by W. with the wind baffling from E. N. E. & E. to E. ends with plenty of rain

E. & E. thick & raining all sail set steering N. by E. at 4 P.M. took in to 2 close reefed main & double reef fore topmast hauled up N. by E. with strong flow of wind & rain middle part thick with rain at 5 P.M. took for ahead have to heading N. E. at 3 A.M. saw breakers on the beach in 10 mile off E. of the all hand set the fore sail courses & 1/2 were ship several times clear to the found the current setting N. by E. from N. E. & E. wind N. E. at daylight wind hauled to N. E. enabled us to head out clear to N. E. & E. but the chains were arranged to N. E. & W. saw a ship Mackerel from N. E. with fine weather employed beating in to the harbor of Valparaiso
