

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 13th 1849

Commenced with moderate breezes from N.E. steering to N.W. all hands employed in clearing up decks & coiling chains at 5 P.M. passed 2 balance 5 miles to seaward at 7 set the anchor land bearing belt from which we took our departure, middle & later part moderate breezes & passing showers course N by W. to end day 173 59 Lat. 16 33 N

Remarks On Board Wednesday March 14th 1849

Commenced with light breezes from E.N.E. & passing showers at 5 P.M. saw Hippo Island to windward middle part baffling latter part the same watches employed at various jobs No Ends

Remarks On Board Thursday March 15th 1849

Commenced with light baffling airs from N.W. steering to N.W. Hippo Island in sight bearing E. about 40 miles Dist middle & latter part the same watches employed at various jobs balance in sight No Ends

Remarks On Board Friday March 16th 1849

Commenced with light breezes from N.W. ship heading to N.E. & E. by the wind middle & latter part the same watches employed at painting around the bands inside & out copper rich off day No Ends

Remarks On Board Saturday March 17th 1849

Commenced with light baffling airs from N.W. ship heading by the wind to N.W. middle & latter part the same accompanied with some rain Long No Ends Lat 14 35

Remarks On Board Sunday March 18th 1849

Commenced with light baffling airs from N.W. ship steering to N.W. middle & latter part much the same at daylight took 4 to N.E. with fresh breeze from N.E. & W. No Ends

Remarks On Board Monday March 19th 1849

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. ship heading to N.W. weather looks dark & low, middle & latter part rain light air & calm No Ends Lat 13 56 Long 173 40 W

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 20th 1849

Commenced with light airs from N.W. ship heading to N.W. & E. by the wind middle part & latter severe rain & light breezes from N.W. caught 6 bbls of fresh water saw a school of blackfish No Ends

Remarks On Board Wednesday March 21st 1849

Commenced with light airs from N.W. heading to N.W. by the wind some rain middle & latter part clear changeable breezes from N.E. to N.W. saw porpoises No Ends took 6 boxes Long per ship Lat 12 54 N

Remarks On Board Thursday March 22nd 1849

Commenced with light airs from N.W. ship heading to N.W. & E. Killed 4-lyp & turned them middle part severe rain latter part cloudy taking alternately as the wind over & below trying to get to N.W. & E. No Ends

Remarks On Board Friday March 23rd 1849 Commenced with moderate breezes from N.W. steering & sailing changeable weather some rain at dusk part ships head to N.W. middle & latter part the same at daylight about ship heading N.E. employed over hauling top line No Ends Long 173 07 Lat 12 08 N

Remarks On Board Saturday March 24th 1849

Commenced with fresh winds from N.W. heading to N.E. at dusk stood to N.W. middle & latter part fine weather saw nothing ship head N.W. ripped old gaff topsail No Ends Long 174 00 W Lat 11 22 N

Remarks On Board Sunday March 25th 1849

Commenced with fine weather. wind N.W. ship heading N.W. & E. by the wind middle & latter part the same all sail set headed N.W. No Ends
