

Remarks On Board Saturday June 2nd 1849

Commenced with fog & light airs from S.E. spoke St. George House middle & latter part fog saw 3 ships at 11 AM set all sail steering E.S.E. Ends clear Long 133° 05' E. Lat 41° 32' N

Remarks On Board Sunday June 3rd 1849

Commenced with light airs from W. steering N.E. St. George House saw nothing at dusk took in sail middle & latter part calm and foggy several ships in sight saw no whales do Ends
Remarks On Board Monday June 4th 1849
Commenced with light calms heading to E. caught 2 seals at dusk shortened sail Ends with fog & light airs from W. steering to E.

Long 133° 25' East Lat 41° 48'

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 5th 1849

Commenced with light breezes from W. W. Y. steering to E. and Phoenix & Friends of New London at dusk shortened sail heading to E. Breach of Broad middle & latter part mostly fog spoke the Globe of N. West fore and a barrel of flour Ends pleasant 3 ships in sight Lat 41° 46' N
Breach of Breach of 2 bars Long 133° 30' E.

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 6th

Commenced with fine weather and nothing at 4 PM which fog heading to N. E. at dusk shortened sail middle & latter part variable at daylight made all sail & took in abeam main top sail spoke Henry Thompson of New London one too blowing strong from W. ship heading N. saw the land bearing N.W. distant 45 miles Lat 41° 56' N
Long per Am 133° 45' Lat 41° 56' N

Remarks On Board Thursday June 7th

Commenced with strong breezes from W. at 4 PM moderate set fore top sail & cleared N.E. at dusk took in sail head to N. middle & latter part moderate gale blowing two spoke Meteor and Power 2300 lbs do Ends steering to N.E. Lat 42° 16'

Remarks On Board Friday June 8th

Commenced with fine weather steering in for the Land at 4 PM saw 1 whale lowered took one along side and had throat & lips laid by middle & latter part fine at 8 AM finished cutting stock in shore heading N. O Ends 1 ship in sight 2 boats

Lat 42° 19' N

Long 134° 50' E

Remarks On Board Saturday June 9th 1849

Commenced with fine weather winds backing steering in shore saw 1 whale did not lower at dusk took in sail heading N.E. winds N.E. thick fog employed boiling middle part fine latter some fog chased 1 whale Ends boiling & setting up shoals Long 134° 52' E. Lat 42° 25'

Remarks On Board Sunday June 10th 1849

Commenced with fog employed boiling at dusk shortened sail & ships in sight middle & latter part variable at 7 AM finished boiling commenced showing down whale turned up 110 lbs several ships in sight spoke the Prochantas of Disbury Ends with fog chased 1 whale

Lat 45 miles to Northward - Lat 42° 03'

Remarks On Board Monday June 11th 1849

Commenced with fog heading off shore chased 1 whale at dusk took in sail middle & latter part strong breeze saw nothing finished showing down do Ends Lat 42° 19'

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 12th 1849

Commenced with strong breezes chased 1 whale got nothing spoke William Thompson Ellis 2500 lbs & middle & latter part fine weather saw no whales employed setting up shoals do Ends

Lat 42° 46'

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 13th

Commenced with strong breezes from W. heading in shore at 3 PM saw 1 whale & great number of whales lowered could not fasten at dusk shortened sail & standing off and on for the night middle & latter part fine lowered & lowered chased about 20 whales could not strike do Ends

Remarks On Board Thursday June 14th

Commenced with thick & raining chasing 1 whale at dusk took in heading N.E. land 11 miles off to N.W. middle & latter part fresh gales laying too do Ends

Lat 42° 28'
