

Remarks On Board Thursday Aug 2^d

Commenced with good weather employed hauling & setting of sharks along whals middle part rain latter fine finished hauling at Noon turned up 250 bls employed stowing down to Ends No Lett End in sight

Remarks On Board Friday Aug 3^d

Commenced with fine weather employed stowing so wind 2 ships in sight middle & latter part fine employed stowing and several ships. No whals to Ends

Remarks On Board Saturday Aug 4th Lett 42 40

Commenced with fine weather employed stowing down finished at sun at whals stowed 200 bls middle & latter part rain breeze from E^{ly} at 10.30 spoke Isaac Howland 4 months and 200 bls to Ends employed stowing away sharks

Remarks On Board Sunday Aug 5th 1841

Commenced with fresh breezes from E^{ly} saw a whale lowered for them 9.30 went on to one missed him stove Boat at dusk took in sail 8 ships in sight Ends with fine weather employed mending Boat Lett 42 19

Remarks On Board Monday Aug 6th

Thruout these twenty four hours fine weather 3 ships in sight chased a whale first part Ends employed cutting over rotten cask

Remarks On Board Tuesday Aug 7th Lett 42 28

Commenced with light air from W^{ly} saw several carcasses steering to N.E. middle & latter part fine weather and finbacks on sail in sight No Ends

Remarks On Board Wednesday Aug 8th

Commenced with fine breezes from E^{ly} heading to E^{ly} at 4.00 m spoke Barry Casack of Liverpool 3 months and 1400 bls middle & latter part fine weather saw nothing No Ends heading to E^{ly} Long per chain 138 1/2 Lett 42 57

Remarks On Board Thursday Aug 9th 1841

Commenced with pleasant weather steering middle & latter part fresh breezes from N.E. steering V^{ly} at 9.00 saw one whale No Ends Lett 42 04

Remarks On Board Friday Aug 10th

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. steering V^{ly} at 4.00 m spoke the Friends of New England 10 whales this season at dusk took in sail at daylight made sail and whals chased to N^{ly} purpose run off at 9.00

Remarks On Board Saturday Aug 11th

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. employed chasing whals missed one at dusk took in sail the whals middle & latter part moderate gales at daylight chased for whals none at 7.00 took in sail to Ends Lett 41 13

Remarks On Board Sunday Aug 12th Commenced with moderate gales from N.E. laying too much close reef main top sail broke out previous to dusk were ship at Spencer's heading to E^{ly} middle & latter part more moderate made sail and finbacks to Ends

Long per chain 137 1/2 Lett 41 54 N

Remarks On Board Monday Aug 13th 1841

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. saying sail to get to N.E. saw one sail & finbacks at dusk close reef the top sail heading E^{ly} middle part the same latter more moderate sail & dead whale No Ends

Lett 42 08

Remarks On Board Tuesday Aug 14th

Commenced with good weather since N.E. chasing whals missed one at dusk took in sail heading to E^{ly} & sail in sight middle & latter part fine weather saw a great number of finbacks sail

Ends steering to Westward

Remarks On Board Wednesday Aug 15th

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. heading to S.E. at dusk that put sail & ship's head to E^{ly} by the wind sail in sight middle & latter part the same & sail in sight hauling to Ends No Lett

Remarks On Board Thursday Aug 16th 1841

Commenced with strong breezes from N.E. all prudent sail set at dusk took in sail saw finbacks middle & latter part the same exchanged signals with a ship hailing saw many finbacks Ends heading to E^{ly}
