

Remarks On Board Sat 3rd 1847

Commenced with fine weather sent on shore 23 crew for water middle & better part fine weather felled 4 1/2 ft poles & put them on board. No Eng

Remarks On Board Sat 3rd 1847

Commenced with fine weather shipped our ¹⁰⁰ men on board the ship Montreal of Boston Chatham master 116 Bundles marked Bx Pioneer's numbers from 1 to 116 - 16 Bundles of Bone marked W. Weight in all 5550
Nov 4th fine weather employed taking on board water blocking & various other jobs at dark part the crew went ashore for the evening all came on board No Eng

Nov 5th 1847

Showery employed sending down main topmast set up a new fitted one at South end sent on shore all came off at 7 P.M.

Nov 6th 1847
fresh breeze employed fitting rigging sent up main topsail yard & hauled on shore by light all came off at 7 P.M.
Nov 7th fine weather employed fitting rigging sending up top gallant mast yard standing down better 4 1/2 ft poles on shore

Remarks On Board Sunday Nov 7th Commenced with fine weather watch on shore on liberty came off in the evening

Nov 8th 1847

Fine weather employed painting beaching out bread & 2 lbs hold 15 bbls to ship champion & Liberty

Nov 9th 1847

Fine weather employed painting & getting off water sent main topsail sound ship going to sea ^{one on the} the day on shore watch off shore

Nov 8th 1847

Partly showery with strong breeze one watch on shore on liberty. 20 lbs of bread to ship Mrs Thompson of No Bedford

Nov 7th 1847

Fine weather sold to ship Liverpool & mounted on shore Chatham on shore over his time
Nov 6th 1847
William Dear Ship Mercury of Warrington was damaged about midnight all met &

Wednesday Friday Nov 9th 1847

Fine weather finished refitting ship one watch on shore so all came on board

Thursday Nov 11th Fine weather nothing to do this morning William Fickard foremast hand gave to me 2 letters for Capt Hathaway which I gave to him after receiving the letter I called him off & asked him if he had written the letter himself he said that he did write it & stated that he did so because he did not want all to know what he said at 10 AM Capt came on board and had Fickard put in double irons & then putting him in irons Francis Redman came off & refused to do duty in the ship Capt Hathaway ordered me to put handcuffs on him I did so William Fickard acknowledged to Capt Hathaway in my presence that he had said he would take Capt Hathaway's life if he weighed anchor and took him to sea in the ship
gave prisoners bread & water for dinner & supper & deck put them in the run for safety

Wednesday Nov 12th 1847

Commenced with fine weather 7 men went on shore on liberty all came off but 4 - gave the prisoners bread & water at dark put them in the run Small Boats Frank Butler James Smith
Friday Monday Nov 13th 1847

Commenced with fine weather at 10 AM took prisoners on board the W. U. S. Ship Com. Prebel Lt. Col. Glen Commander for Punishment Wm Fickard sold 4 Dox lobes Francis Redman 2 Dox by Mr of said Comander in presence of the W. U. S. Consul Capt Hathaway & 2 of his ship's company & then were delivered to the clergy on shore their chest & clothing were delivered to the Consul. Discharged 4th mate

Remarks On Board Nov 14th 1847

Fine weather employed Deutchizing & shipping over Deutchyell 3rd mate got off some poles finished getting off biscuits removed on board 4 men that shipped here at 10 AM ordered took aboard anchor & Eng shipped 24 mtd & 24 mtd 1st Miron J. Eaton 3rd Miller

Remarks On Board Nov 15th 1847

Commenced with fine weather winds N.E. at 11 AM took the main topmast the crowd at 1 PM pilot came on board made sail & stood out side to and on for the night showed aboard anchor double reef the topsails at 10 PM & made hill bearing at 10 1/2 miles Dist Capt. F. one 12 cwt shot shore for the night middle & latter part fine weather at 11 AM shore at 10 ran close in among the shipping
Nov 14th 1847
came off shore up W. U. S. made all out at 10 AM
at dark lost sight
