Remarks Onboard Sunday Dec 23rd

Commenced with moderate breezes from ESE. all sail set. Course WNW. Saw nothing. People employed shacking rigging middle & latter part. Light airs & calm. So Ends

Remarks Onboard Monday Dec 24th

Commenced with light airs from ESE. clear ship heading to NW. The wind middle part strong breezes took in shacking sails & ship steering NW. latter part fresh gales took in main top sail at 10 AM & fore top gallant sail under ESE. So Ends

Remarks Onboard Tuesday Dec 25th

Commenced with strong breezes from ESE. course NW. all prudent sail. Set clear weather middle & latter part. Fine weather all sail set employed repairing fore & main stay sail. So Ends

Remarks Onboard Wednesday Dec 26th

Commenced with moderate breezes from ESE. course NW. all sail set. Middle & latter part light breezes & calm. Employed repairing main top sail at daylight and House & lower bearing. So Ends

Remarks On Board Thursday Dec 27th

Commenced with light breezes from ESE. clear steering NW. W. saw much Hove & land bearing. Steered to NW. mid air light breeze. Up NW. for the level & boats sent in shore. Fish came off at noon. So Ends

Remarks On Board Friday Dec 28th

Commenced with calm sea & Bork took 2 sperm whale carcasses for the distribution of skins 6 months and 400 sperm. Steady light airs from ESE. middle & latter part light airs course NW. NW. NW. Employed sail mending. So Ends same. Lat 32 30 N

Remarks On Board Saturday Dec 29th

Commenced with moderate breezes from NW. clear weather all. Sail set course NW. NW. Middle & latter part fresh breezes from NW. all sail set saw nothing. So Ends

Remarks Onboard Sunday Dec 30th

Commenced with a shift of wind to West & moderate gale took in light sails double reefed the top sails. Steered NW. NW. Middle part more moderate. At night sprake & main & fore sail. Latter part fine weather made all sail. So Ends. Mr Norton at the

Remarks Onboard Monday Dec 31st

Commenced with moderate breezes from NW. steering NW. NW. by the wind all sail set middle & latter part light and puffing clear employed painting. Sail mending at dinner. So Ends

Remarks On Board Tuesday Dec 31 January 1st 1850

Commenced with light airs from SE. steering NW. NW. Middle & latter part the same. Latter part calm at midnight saw the light on Seabury head bearing NW. 8 24 miles. Dist hauled for 10 or 12 miles. Dist calm. So Ends

Remarks Onboard Wednesday January 2nd 1850

Commenced with calm sea & light huffing airs at 8 AM. Pilot off the beach. Steered in to the Passare at 7 took 2 sperm. NW. took in sail came to anchor in 10 fathoms better at 10. Took the anchor proceeded to town. So came to anchor. Got ready to haul in to the wharf. So Ends
