Fine employed in hoisting out cargo 25 cask of
39 cask of whale

Jan 11th 1850

finished breaking out cleaned out ship croppers & caulkers at
work

Jan 12th 1850 Employed in clearing up hauling to another
ship preparing to copper

Jan 13th 1850 employed in ship duty men at work by the day

Jan 14th employed in coppering ship caulkers at work

15th fine weather shipping oil on board the Honduras

16th fine weather employed at ship duty

17th fine weather employed coppering

18th finished coppering commenced taking

Remarks On Board Saturday Jan 19th 1850

Commenced with strong brickfielders employed coppering & throwing oil on
board the Honduras

Sunday Jan 20th Strong breeze from W & clear

Remarks Monday 21st Jan Employed fitting ship & coppering oil

Tuesday 22nd Jan Employed in taking cash & coppering discharges 1498 lbs
old copper delivered to Smith Campbell & Co heeled the ship off from the
wharf

Wednesday Jan 23rd 1850 Employed coppering oil & putting it on board the
Honduras 12 tons have

Thursday Jan 24th 1850 Fine weather employed coppering oil
& shipping on board the Honduras fitting ship

Friday Jan 25th 1850 Fresh breeze from W employed coppering
oil & throwing it filling around the mast & other up with
the men

Saturday Jan 26th 1850 Commenced with fine weather
no wind port this day

Sunday Jan 27th 1850 Fine shipping coming & going to
sea so ends

Monday Jan 28th 1850

Commenced with fine weather employed shipping oil
