Commenced with fine weather & breeze from N.E. all sail set
The same winds N.E. latter part pleasant & light winds
from N.W. employed pulling, rigging, and hauling potatoes &c. Ends
Lat 33 11 N

Remarks Onboard Saturday Feb 9th

Commenced with pleasant weather winds from N.W. all sail
set, course E by S. hands employed at various jobs middle &
latter part fine saw nothing, employed at various jobs steering,
etc. etc. Delt out slops to the men & molasses

Long 167 30 East

Remarks Onboard Sunday Feb 10th

Commenced with fine breezes from N.E. & pleasant heading to
S.E. by the wind all sail set middle & latter part light &
suffling breezes from E. at daylight looked to N.W. &c. Ends
Lat 33 31 N

Remarks Onboard Monday Feb 11th

Commenced with light airs from N.W. all sail set heading to E.
by the wind lowered 2 times for black fish to 20 fathoms. Middle
& latter part winds shifted to N.W. steered E by N with 2 fms to
breeze employed at various jobs

Capt. Hathaway, unwell

Remarks Onboard Tuesday Feb 12th

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. & all sail set
steering E by S. at 1 P.M. saw a large whale to windward &
whale at dusk but in fog at middle part the same
heading to N.W. by the wind at daylight saw a
Bryane steering to N.W. &c. Ends

Capt. Hathaway unwell

Remarks Onboard Wednesday Feb 13th

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. & all prudent sail set heading
to E by S. hands employed at various jobs capt some wore middle part
the same latter part moderate employed at various jobs saw nothing
Capt. Hathaway, very unwell.

Remarks Onboard Thursday Feb 14th

Commenced with moderate breezes from N.E. heading to E by S. by the
wind at 2 P.M. saw a ship to windward heading to N.W. at 8 P.M. took
ship heading N.W. & middle part, strong breezes double reefed the topsails
took in jib. Latter part the same at 8 P.M. took in main sail fished futtocks
to mainmast & brace bolts &c. Ends

Capt. Hathaway, growing worse

Remarks Onboard Friday Feb 15th

Commenced with fresh gale from N.W. took in fore topsail at 1 P.M.
headed to E by S. at 4 P.M. spoke ship Roumen of Boston 11 days
in company, told Capt. Hathaway was sick asked him to
come onboard but it was too rugged he bore up to it & saw ship heading
to N.W. under short sail middle part the same Capt. Hathaway
some worse to night latter part more moderate made sail at
midnight & double reefed topsail. Ends heading N.W. by the wind
2 men freed sick off duty

Remarks Onboard Saturday Feb 16th
Commenced with moderate gale from N.W. all prudent sail set at
2 P.M. headed ship heading to E by S. Capt. Hathaway no better
middle latter part strong breeze & heavily took in main sail
jib at daylight made sail &c. Ends Long 174 52 E Lat 32 45

Remarks Onboard Sunday Feb 17th

Commenced with strong breeze from N.W. heading to E by S. the
wind appear double reefed courses & jib middle part
Capt. No better middle fresh set haul topsails steered
& men freed E by S. until 5 P.M. bore up North under
some better
