

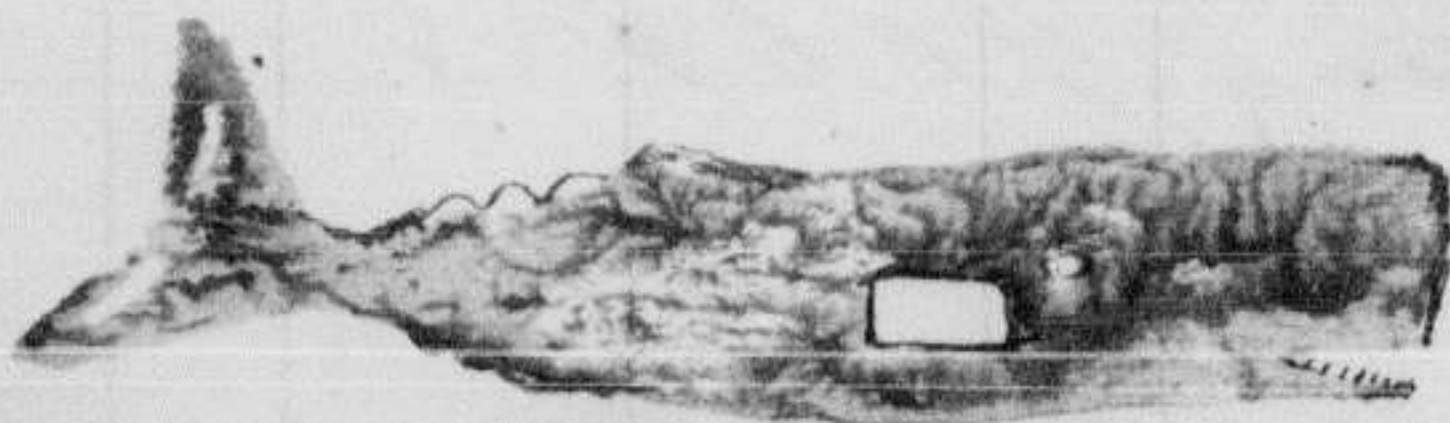
Remarks Onboard Friday May 17th 1850

Commenced with strong breezes from E. & E. at 11th. made
reft the topsails shearing N. E. & saw nothing thick board
at 1 PM took in main sail headed by the wind middle
part took in fore topsail at daylight set it at 1 PM set main sail
which at noon gave it to 10 AM and 2 points & one sail
at End Long 112 04 Lat by Obs 59 00 by Reck 59 00

Remarks Onboard Saturday May 18th
Commenced with strong breezes from E. & E. at 11th. made
N. E. & E. at 3 PM spoke Liverpool & Bedford off
at 3 30 miles out 28 00th middle & latter part thick & rainy much
sail headed in shore and for head so Enos left 8 PM
Lat by Obs 60 10 N Lat by Reck 60 10 N
Long 112 19 E

Remarks Onboard Sunday May 19th

Commenced with fresh breezes from E. & E. heading S. & M
in shore at 2 PM saw sperm whales lower & lower part struck
the middle of the back struck & drew a tooth the whale along side
made him fast now ship heading off & here land in sight in
S. & M 30 miles distant standing off shore under reft topsails & quarter
watches at midnight fluke chain parted & carried a whale out by the line
to windward took in fore sail & fore topsail under S. & E. ship making
about 10 PM light Enos with severe snow storm and gales
leaving port in sight Branch & Enos at each of Reck
& one the part one Reck
Left 8 PM
Long 80 19 E



Remarks Onboard Monday May 20th

Commenced with strong gales from S. & E. & severe snow
storm & rain by 10 AM at midnight at 3 PM
& M called all hands to head boat whale along
side put fluke chain on line cleared
snow off deck commenced cutting
out in bottles so Enos thick & snowy
from Enos Left 8 PM

Remarks Onboard Tuesday May 21st

Commenced with light airs from S. & E. taking in main part head for
thruing up made sail heading S. & E. land bearing N. by N. 1/2 N
at 1 PM called all hands to head to get ease to S. & E. put
head skin lost case made sail heading South blowing fresh from
E. & E. thick & rainy so Enos

Remarks Onboard Wednesday May 22nd
Commenced with fresh breezes from E. & E. heading North under
double reft topsails thick & rainy weather middle part severe snow
storm at 1 PM cleared off snow off deck commenced boiling and
haul to West now ship steered E. by S. so Enos with passing fog
Left by Obs 59 08 N Lat by Reck 59 08 N
Long per Chron 110 43 E

Remarks Onboard Thursday May 23rd 1850

Commenced with strong breezes from N. & N. E. heading E. by N. sailing
at 8 PM saw 2 sail at 1 PM took in sail shearing N. by N
middle & latter part fine weather employed boiling & stowing
along shore to the S. & E. one sail in sight Long 113 00 E Lat 60 00 N

Remarks Onboard Friday May 24th 1850

Commenced with strong breezes from N. & N. E. heading N. & E. sailing
along shore to the S. & E. land 10 miles off bearing N. by N. at 2 PM spoke
the Thetis these of Bedford 30 months out 1400 lbs middle
& latter part variable at 1 PM spoke ship Wabash of N. Bedford
months out 400 another sail in sight at 10 PM commenced stowing
down so Enos with fresh gales from N. & E. took in sail
so Enos

Remarks Onboard Saturday May 25th

Commenced with fresh gales from N. & N. E. employed stowing
down sperm oil finished boiling & stowing at 1 PM
dark 11 PM middle part heading to S. & E.
middle & latter part fresh gales laying
so Enos
