Wednesday May 31st

First part commences with a light rain from the W steering E brake abt sunset sundown Wind the same middle part strong breeze from the W at daylight squalls around saw a Humpback hauled to the st later part had a squall of rain took in light sail so ends this day

Thursday June 1st

First part of these twenty four hours commences with a strong wind from the W heading to the E at sundown took in upper topsails and Foresail middle part strong wind from the st at daylight squally later part more moderate set topsails wind hauled to the W so ends this day

Friday June 2nd

First part of these twenty four hours commences with a good breeze from the st W steering E at sundown took in sail middle part wind the same at daylight fine weather set topsails and topgallant sail later part employed in ship's duties so ends this day

Saturday June 3rd

First part commences with a good breeze from the st W steering E at sundown took in sail middle part wind the same at daylight fresh breeze from the st W took in lower four topsails at daylight thick and squally at six set the lower topsail wind hauled to E later part rainy took in lower topsail so ends this day

First part of these twenty four hours commences with a strong rain and rain from the st heading E S E at three P M cleared off at sundown wind the same middle part came on rainy wind at daylight put on starboard took later part moderate gale and rainy took in to close reef main topmast and stuns the sails so ends this day at 6 P M

Monday June 5th

First part commences with a moderate gale from the st W with rain a fair wind hauled to E at sundown wind the same middle part moderated and cleared up wind at daylight fine breeze made sail two sails in sight later part wind the same so ends this day

Tuesday June 6th

First part of these twenty four hours commences with a fine breeze from the st W at sundown took in sail middle part wind the same at daylight made all sail later part employed in ship's duties so ends this day

First part commences with a good breeze from the st W evening at sundown took in sail heading to the st middle part wind breeze up strong at daylight fresh breeze from the st W to W S W later part moderate gale took in lower topsail so ends this day
