Remarks On Board Bark Platina

Thursday June 8th

First part of these twenty four hours commences
With a moderate gale from the S W to W S W
Heaving to the S under lower main topsail and
Staysail at sundown rain the same middle
Part moderated at daylight rain light set the
Topsails latter part employed in ships duties
So ends this day Lat 11 N Long 98 11 W

Friday June 10th

First part of these twenty four hours commences
with a light rain from the N W to W S W
cruising at sundown rain the same middle part
Wind moderate at daylight gale breeze from the
W S W saw a large ship a total wreck made
All sail and marked up to her at nine sent an
Boat of her and got some blacks and small
shoes her name was the Dagmar came
With timber and full of water mizen topsail
gone and main mast to the deck and fore topsail
mast got one sail the jib the rest had blown away
So ends this day Lat 11 N Long 98 45 W Long by Chron 98 48 W

Saturday June 11th

First part of these twenty four hours commences
With a gale breeze from the W S W cruising
At sundown took in sail middle part strong
Wind from S S W at daylight wind the same later
Part employed in ships duties so ends this day

Sunday June 12th

First part commences with a strong wind from the S S
W cruising at sundown rain the same middle part
Wind light from S W daylight made sail latter
part rain W light squalls of rain so ends this day
Lat 11 N Long 98 40 W Long by Chron 98 35 W

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Platina Cruising On Western ground

Monday June 13th

First part of these twenty four hours commences
With a moderate breeze from the W cruising
At four o'clock an early rain hailed to the S
At sundown took in sail middle part rain
N E at daylight rain S part rain the same
So ends this day Lat 11 N Long 98 45 W Long by Chron 98 48 W

Tuesday June 14th

First part commences with a light rain from
the S arriving at sundown rain the same
At daylight wind light put up tacks and
Boards of out between decks latter part
breaking ships stores so ends this day

Lat 11 N Long 98 42 W
Long by Chron 98 24 W

Wednesday June 15th

First part twenty four hours commences with
a gale breeze from the S arriving at sundown
Wind the same middle part strong breeze
From the S W at daylight wind strong set the
Topsails and steamed E latter part employed in
ships duties so ends this day Lat 11 N Long 98 49 W
Long by Chron 98 49 W

Thursday June 16th

First part twenty four hours commences with a
strong breeze from S W steering E at four
o'clock to the S at sundown rain the same
Middle part rain the same at daylight wind
strong from S E latter part employed in
ships duties steering S S E so ends this day
Lat 11 N Long 98 42 W
Long by Chron 98 40 W
