

Remarks On Board Bark Platina

Wednesday May 9th

First part commences with a gale from the S. S. W. heading to the W. to S. W. at five o'clock hauler to the Waane ship headed S. S. W. middle part rain the same latter part squalls of rain saw the land bearing N. W. W. dist 25 miles at four P. M. took in rain to point sundown rain S. W. at midnight moderated so ends this day. A. Thursday May 10th

First part commences with a moderate gale from the S. heading E. S. E. set main topsail at daylight fresh breeze with heavy swell from S. W. cantain in sight middle part wind moderated latter part rain same at sundown set fore topsail had in sight bearing from it to S. W. dist 25 miles at midnight strong breeze so ends this day. Lat 35.18 S Long 118.17 E

Friday May 11th

First part commences with a strong breeze from S. S. W. heading S. E. under two lower topsails at daylight rain the same middle and latter part strong winds and squalls of rain cantain in sight so ends this day. Lat 35.05 S Long 120.12 E

Saturday May 12th

First part commences with a moderate breeze from the S. W. heading to the S. E. set topsails and main topsail to lower topsails at four P. M. hauler to the cantain and exchanged signals sundown wind light at midnight strong wind squalls so ends this day. Lat 35.55 S Long 120.36 E

Sunday May 13th

First part commences with a fresh breeze from W. S. W. to W. W. with squalls at daylight rain the same middle part clearing cantain in sight latter part breeze up at four P. M. hauler in fore topsail sundown headed to the E. rain W. S. W. at midnight rain the same set fore main topsail so ends this day. Lat 36.28 S Long 120.15 E

Monday May 14th

First part commences with a fresh breeze from the W. heading N. W. W. at daylight set jib and spanker middle part breezing up noon took in jib and spanker latter part hauler in fore and main topsails at sundown moderate gale headed S. S. W. rain W. at midnight fresh breeze from same so ends this day. Lat 35.27 S Long 120.09 E

Tuesday May 15th

First part commences with a strong breeze from the W. with a heavy swell from S. W. at daylight headed to the E. latter part moderated set upper main topsail at three P. M. headed to the S. S. W. at sundown head S. W. rain W. S. W. had a squall to in all but lower topsails at midnight rain the same so ends this day. Lat 35.50 S Long 119.50 E

Wednesday May 16th

First part commences with a strong breeze from the W. to W. S. W. heading from S. S. W. to S. W. at daylight rain the same at eight saw both high days gear from the main called all hands heave two and went to work pulling them put chains around the bowsprit middle part employed canvas putting on the masts and both masts broke off short at latter part heavy squalls of rain at four P. M. finished setting up and cleared up decks at sundown rain the same at midnight rain the same so ends this day.

Thursday May 17th A. C. B.

First part commences with a moderate breeze from the W. to W. S. W. heading from S. S. W. to S. W. at daylight made all sail middle part light rain from W. latter part more employed in ships clothes at seven P. M. hauler calms at midnight so ends this day. Lat 36.00 S Long 119.12 E
