

Remarks On Board Bark Platina

Wednesday June 6th

First part commences with a gale breeze from the N at daylight got ready and men down the rest of the sail middle part breezing latter part stowed away and was the decks sundown took in main topsail blowing fresh with rain at midnight blew a fresh gale with a heavy swell from the N. Lat 35 46 S

Thursday June 7th

First part commences with a smart gale from the W with a heavy swell heading to the N at daylight squally middle and latter part same at midnight wind the same so ends this day

Lat 36 24 Long 116 20 E

Friday June 8th

First part commences with a gale from the WSW with a heavy swell at daylight squally middle moderate same latter part moderate gale at midnight rain the same so ends this day

Lat 35 55 S Long 116 45 E

Saturday June 9th

First part commences with a moderate gale from the W heading to the S middle part moderate latter part same at rise headed to the N at midnight moderate so ends this day

Lat 35 35 S Long 116 55 E

Sunday June 10th

First part commences with a strong breeze from the W heading in at daylight set fore and main and foremast at eight at 10 saw haul heard bearing NNE dist 18 miles more ship and steered ESE middle and latter part same the same sundown haul to the S at midnight rain light from the W so ends this day

Lat 35 35 S Long 117 55 E

Monday June 11th

First part commences with a light breeze from the W at daylight main and foremast bearing NNE dist 30 miles middle and latter part employed in beaching out between decks and lumber rack sundown finished so ends this day

Tuesday June 12th

First part commences with a light wind from the W at daylight wind the same haul in sight haul head fl bearing NNE dist 20 miles middle part same WSW saw the cotton latter part same the same at 10 PM spoke cotton at midnight calm so ends this day

Lat 35 46 S

Wednesday June 13th

First part commences with a calm at daylight light breeze from the N E set all sail steered W middle and latter part same the same haul head bearing NNE dist 30 miles sundown took in sail at midnight wind light from the N so ends this day

Lat 35 52 S Long 117 48 E

Thursday June 14th

First part commences with a light air from the N at daylight wind haul NNE middle part employed in fetching water in fore haul came on rain rain haul NNE latter part wind the same sundown cleared up at midnight squally air rain rain light from the W so ends this day

Lat 35 52 S

Friday June 15th

First part commences with a light air and calms middle part breeze up with squalls of rain from the WSW latter part breeze up strong took in sail at midnight breezing took in fore to foremast so ends this day

Lat 35 40 S Long 117 20 E

Saturday June 16th

First part commences with a moderate gale from the WSW at six PM took in main topsail middle part squally latter part moderate at 10 PM set main to foremast sundown haul to the N

Lat 35 55 S Long 117 26 E
