

Remarks On Board Bark Platina

Thursday June 28th

First part commenced with a fresh gale with heavy squalls from WSW to W lying under two stays with middle and latter part same at sundown heavy swell at midnight in the same way ends this day
Lat 36° 09' S Long 118° 31' E

Friday June 29th

First part commenced with a gale from the W at daylight moderate set topsails and staysails middle part still moderating latter part moderate breeze at nine headed to the S at midnight squally with thunder &c ends this day
Lat 35° 10' S Long 118° 53' E

Saturday June 30th

First part commenced with a strong breeze from the W at daylight headed to the S at middle part rain same rain & squalls to the S latter part rain S W at four P.M. saw the lower Cape Knab bearing S by W distant 30 miles at midnight rain light &c ends this day
Lat 35° 04' S Long 119° 25' E

Sunday July 1st

First part commenced with a light wind from S W at daylight set all sail headed to the S W by W middle and latter part rain same at seven headed W S W at midnight gale breeze from the S W so ends this day
Lat 35° 16' S Long 119° 45' E

Monday July 2nd

First part commenced with a strong wind from the S W heading W S W at daylight saw the cantan at nine A.M. saw three large whales going quick to the E saw them two rising latter part rain the same at two P.M. saw a can to the cantan the had a large whale a furry side cutting at sundown rain W at midnight rain the same so ends this day

First part commenced with a strong breeze from the W at daylight headed to the S middle part squally latter part same at midnight rain the same so ends this day
Lat 36° 06' S Long 118° 54' E

Wednesday July 4th

First part commenced with a strong breeze from the W at daylight rain the same at seven at 10 sent down the lower main topsail to repair latter part rain W W at three P.M. sent up topsail and came ship to the S W at midnight rain S W heading W so ends this day
Lat 35° 03' S Long 118° 59' E

Thursday July 5th

First part commenced with a strong breeze from the S heading W W at daylight sent down foretopsail to repair middle and latter part mending sail at five P.M. sent up topsail at midnight breeze to a gale with heavy squalls so ends this day
Lat 36° 02' S Long 117° 56' E

Friday July 6th

First part commenced with a heavy gale from the W with heavy squalls at daylight heavy swell middle and latter part same at four P.M. came ship to the S W at midnight rain the same with squalls so ends this day
Lat 36° 02' S Long 118° 15' E

Saturday July 7th

First part commenced with a gale from W S W at daylight moderate set main topsail middle part heavy swell latter part moderating at midnight moderated to a light rain so ends this day
Lat 36° 12' S Long 118° 13' E

Sunday July 8th

First part commenced with a fine breeze from the W at daylight made all sail middle part rain same latter part rain headed at 10 P.M. the same hauld Secord hearing of dist 30 miles at four P.M. steared to the W S W sundown rain &c
