Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> Sept

First part commences with a fresh breeze from the S.E. with a heavy swell hailing middle part rain some latter part moderate same sundown wind same at midnight from S. so ends this day

Wednesday Sept 19<sup>th</sup>

First part commences with a light rain from the S. employed in hailing at eight o'clock to sundown head ail middle and latter part same at sundown calm midnight rain breeze up from the West steered S. so ends this day

Lat 36.15 Long 115.54

Thursday Sept 20<sup>th</sup>

First part commences with a light rain from the West steering S. at daylight breeze up and hauled to the N.W. to haul in topsails employed in hailing middle part breezing latter part heavy gale from the W. at eight P.M. hauled down and cleared up decks and washed all up for the night at nine P.M. got supper and set three watches at midnight obtaining a gale with a heavy sea on board this day

Friday Sept 21<sup>st</sup>

First part commences with a gale from the W.S.W. at daylight moderated middle part heavy swell from N.W. at noon started fire again latter part with light at eleven P.M. blacksmith broke his leg by a cask of oil ship sailed on deck felt her along midnight set it so ends this day

Saturday Sept 22<sup>nd</sup> Long 116.54

First part commenced with a light air from S.W. at five P.M. sailed down and made all sail middle part getting ready to start at in fore peak latter part starting down at sundown lashed up for the night steamed in light sails gave breeze from S. to S.W. at midnight strong breeze from S.W. so ends this day

Sunday Sept 23<sup>rd</sup>

First part commences with a strong breeze from the N.W. heading E. at daylight rain same at night. more ship headed N.W. middle part same same latter part moderate sundown more ship at midnight rain light from the N.W. so ends this day

Monday Sept 24<sup>th</sup>

First part commences with a light rain from the N.W. at daylight got ready to start down in after hole middle part rain hauled out W. to the S. and made sail in company with caution latter part rain light at five P.M. started again and washed up sails the land hearing N.E. dist 15 miles sundown about calm at midnight rain same so ends this day

Tuesday Sept 25<sup>th</sup>

First part commences with a light rain from the N.E. at daylight rain same starting down seven small casts of air middle part started at nine P.M. latter part rain same at sundown rain light land in sight Cape Horn hearing N.E. dist 15 miles at midnight rain hauled out S. so ends this day

Wednesday Sept 26

First part commences with a strong breeze from the N.E. at daylight rain same employed in washing ship middle part rain hauled to the N.W. and changed latter part breezing sundown moderate gale at gardeners hearing N.E. dist 15 miles caution in sight at midnight clearing a gale so ends this day

Thursday Sept 27<sup>th</sup>

First part commences with a gale from the N.W. West at daylight took in main topsail middle part rain same latter part moderate same more ship headed to the N.W. at midnight moderated set topsails so ends this day
