

Remarks on Board Bark Platina
Thursday Oct 31st

First part commenced with a moderate gale from the S heading NW at daylight saw a merchant ship steering to the SE & middle and latter part same sunken moderate same with a heavy swell running midnight same so ends the day
Lat 36° 30' S Long 48° 05' W

Friday Nov 1st

First part commenced with a good breeze from the NW heading NW at daylight made sail saw a number of fishbacks and humpbacks middle and latter part rain SW headed SE at 10 p.m. headed to S Main SE & saw a merchant harkenteen sunken rain light midnight same so ends this day
Lat 36° 09' S Long 48° 09' W

Saturday Nov 2nd

First part commenced with a moderate breeze from the SE at daylight rain & SE steering SE at 10 p.m. saw a whale but did not get an middle and latter part rain at 10 p.m. PT came on board and put off SW at midnight same so ends this day
Lat 36° 38' S Long 48° 10' W

Sunday Nov 3rd

First part commenced with a good breeze from the NW steering SW at 10 p.m. came an unusually daylight rain headed out SW in a squall making doing middle part rain strong put off SE at 10 p.m. part rain same saw a steamer steering to the sunken headed to the W main track in sail midnight rain same so ends this day
Lat 38° 00' S

Monday Nov 4th S Long 49° 40' W

First part commenced with a good breeze from the NW at daylight made sail employed in ship's duties at 10 p.m. put off SE at 10 p.m. at half past ten saw a right whale going to the SE got ready to take middle part rain light latter part same one saw another one headed but did not chase them to SE sunken came on board and took in sail midnight same so ends

Tuesday Nov 5th

First part commenced with a good breeze from the NW at daylight made sail steamed SE & saw a number of humpbacks middle part rain same latter part saw humpbacks and black fish sunken track in sail and headed to the W midnight rain same so ends this day

Wednesday Nov 6th S Long 48° 39' W

First part commenced with a fresh breeze from the SW heading to the NW under two sails the sails employed in ship's duties middle part rain put off SE at 10 p.m. headed to S Main SE & saw a merchant harkenteen sunken rain light midnight same so ends this day
Lat 37° 12' S

Thursday Nov 7th S Long 48° 30' W

First part commenced with a light rain from the SW made sail saw a number of fishbacks and humpbacks at nine o'clock sent up the main gallant sail at half past ten saw right whales headed and headed last struck and killed him with a pierce gun whale sank and took a half tank the line to the ship and have him up saw more whales two boats chased but did not get an latter part rain light at eight o'clock set fair watches midnight rain same so ends this day
Lat 36° 50' S Long 48° 40' W

Friday Nov 8th

First part commenced with light rain from the NW at daylight headed on and got in gear in nine at 10 p.m. middle part rain same at 10 p.m. finished outfit and cleared away the head at eight o'clock started fire midnight rain at 10 p.m. so ends this day
Lat 39° 10' S Long 48° 34' W
