

Remarks, San Baruel Beach Station
Saturday Nov 9th

First part commences with a light rain from N.W. & then S.W. came on a heavy swell from S.E. with black and squally weather day light - light air, at eight of the same air to black in a squall from S.W. took in all but fore and main stay sail two men went out to pull foremast stay sail ship picked up a shark and man off and caught on the back of the main and saw him eat a shark and put everything below deck middle heavy gale with heavy squalls latter part same midnight

so ends this day Lat 37° 10' S Long 48° 15' W

Sunday Nov 10th

First part commences with a heavy gale from S.E. laying to the S.W. day light more moderate middle part got ready to start fires latter part fresh breeze at two P.M. started fires at midnight moderate sea ship sails this day Lat 37° 03' S Long 49° 25' W

Monday Nov 11th

First part commences with a moderate breeze from the S heading E.S.E. employed in hauling middle and latter part same sundown rain light midnight same so ends this day Lat 37° 10' S Long 49° 15' W

Tuesday Nov 12th

First part commences with a light air and calm employed in hauling at eight of the fore and main off middle part broke out ready to start sails latter part same same at four P.M. started off the whole sundown light air from the E midnight rain light from S.W. so ends this day Lat 36° 53' S Long 49° 28' W

Wednesday Nov 13th

First part commences with a moderate breeze from S.W. & heading E employed in starting sails middle part same latter part rain same saw a whale ship heading to the E and off a case too and took in sail midnight rain light so ends this day Lat 36° 52' S Long 49° 15' W

Thursday Nov 14th

First part commences with a gam breeze from the N.W. at daylight breeze up at six of the same the bark the main of new hull and capt. Salomon came on board a little while later an harrier came on to rain rain hail and S.S.W. middle part part off at latter part breeze up at four took in fore to trail on hauler to the W sundown moderate gale midnight blowing a gale from S.W. so ends this day Lat 37° 20' S Long 48° 04' W

Friday Nov 15th

First part commences with a moderate gale from the S.W. heading to the N.W. under staysails at daylight breeze up with heavy swell in middle part saw a fair master ship heading to the S latter part commences to moderate sundown more moderate the main in sight midnight rain moderate so ends this day Lat 36° 35' S Long 48° 50' W

Saturday Nov 16th

First part commences with a moderate breeze from the N.W. day light made sail and headed to the S.W. saw the merrimack employed in scraping haul saw him back middle part strong breeze from W.W.W. latter part part off at four sundown took in sail and headed to the S.W. midnight rain light from W.W.W. so ends this day Lat 36° 36' S Long 49° 01' W

Sunday Nov 17th

First part commences with a light rain from W.W.W. daylight headed to the N.W. making heavy middle and latter part rain same sundown from dawn to 2-7 fresh lower fore topsail at midnight rain light with fog squalls so ends this day Lat 37° 13' S

Monday Nov 18th

First part commences with a light rain from the S.E. saw a bark made sail employed in ships stores middle and latter part rain breeze at four P.M. made the merrimack sundown strong breeze took in the lower topsails midnight rain the same so ends this day Lat 37° 17' S Long 48° 44' W
