

Remarks on Board Bark Platina

Monday Jan 13th

First part commenced with a calm daylight light air from
 N. made sail steered E by S 1/2 S in ship's
 better middle and latter part light air from the N
 at five P.M. saw a pair of large whales going in S.W.
 however but did not get an chance until dark
 came on hoare and took in sail midnight thick
 fog so ends this day Lat 33° 30' S Long 46° 17' W
 I July 46

Thursday Jan 14th

First part commenced with a gale breeze from the N
with a thick fog day light made sail at eight o'clock
app. steamed E by S by a in ship's track middle
part breezed up tack in sail no other part strong
breeze from NW W hauled as the main boat
at five P.M. mine hauled to W & SW more breeze
up fresh tack in all but lower main topsail
making it mine some sa ends this day Lat 39.28 Long 44.57

Wednesday Jan 15th

First part commences with a strong breeze from the S.E.
day light moderate snow three sails at ten o'clock
made sail and signalled an American ship but
could not make out her numbers middle part
wind light latter part same sudden took in
sail midnight nine by light again, this day 1793 10 Jan 1800

Thursday Jan 16th

First part commenced with a light rain from the C & C
cruising day light set all our employes in repairing
fore and middle part finished and bent it
better part set fore staysail in and took out the
clark at point I sent it and saw a whale ship
underway took in our heads of Wm daylight rain
light so ends the day Lat 93° 10' S Long 45° 27' W

Friday, Jan 17th

First part commenced with a light rain from the E
the light made sail at ten o'clock spoke the gay
head minelle and latter part rain same at
sun down took in sail midnight rain by lot
sailed this day Lat 33. 37 S
Long 101. 19 W

Saturday Jan 18th

First part commenced with a moderate breeze from the E by N light made sail & got head in sight employed in ships duties. Middle and latter part much same & under way that in sail midnight in light & ends that day Lat 93° 30' S Long 45° 29' W

Sunday Jan 19th

First part came on with a gale breeze from the
E. cruising day light made sail nothing doing
middle am latter part rained some at 4 pm
spoke the Gay Head at ten 1/2th cap't came on
board here at midnight in same vessel this
day Lat 33nd 06 S Long 69th 08 W

Monday Jan 21st

First part commences with a light wind from S.E.
day light made sail gay here in sight emphasized
in ships cluster middle and latter part mine
same sundays took in sail were ships at
midnight mine light so ends this day Luff 32428
July 45. 12 W

Tuesday Jan 21st

First part commences with a light rain from the E S
E evening day light made sail gay head in right
emphases in ships duties middle and latter part
rain same wind down that in sail midnight rain
light so ends this day Lat 33° 00' S Long 45° 09' W
Wed July 9 1851

Wednesday June 22nd

First part commences with a light wind from the E
creasing daylight made sail emphasized in ships
duties middle and latter part rain came at
sundown took in sail saw two sails run beam
and gay head midnight and light ran ends this day
Lat 39 57 S Long 45 13 W
Thursday June 20

Thursday June 23rd

First part commences with a light rain from the N E daylight made
sail employed in ship duties middle part had a warm
turn from N E came to N E again with light rain
lastly part cleared off sun came took in sail at
midnight rain light so ended this day Lat 39 15 W
Long 85 46 W
