

On the Passage to New Bedford & Enquiring for sperm Whales
Remarks Tuesday June 3 1890

Came in fresh Tredos and some what ruzed & quite
Pleasant Weather employed Whaling at 1.15 a.m.
Cut in took Starboard Boats Whale long side captured two
Found small ones at 2.15. Commenced to cut in at 2.15. had
Boats Both Whales in middle Net getting ready to Bail
and Pumping Ship. took about inch per hour
little more than usual Started the Works at 5. P.M.
to Bail. Wind light and quite Pleasant -

Wednesday June 4 Long 42 09 West
Commenced with light Tredos and Pleasant Weather
from the E.N.E. employed Boiling and other like jobs
middle do the latter part do better at 3.30 a.m.
finished Boiling and at 7.30 took out after hole to
stow & stowed all full back in Ground all that was cold
after hole through and shifted Provisions to main keelth opened
back. By. & Port. to Rise

Thursday June 5

Commenced with light Wind and Pleasant Weather
on S.E. Tack under short dent stowing all after
finishing hole & shifting Provisions middle Net went out
stowing the same employed stowing remainder Port of
the oil in after hole & finished
hole

Long 43.0. West

Friday June 6

Commenced with light E.N.E. Tredos and Pleasant
Weather at 1.15 a.m. Wore Ship. to the E.E. under short
sail employed Whaling Ship. and other odd jobs
middle & the latter part went out the same
round New Shear in Brown Guyes & opened back

Saturday June 7 Lat. 14.13 North
Came in with light N.E. by Wind Pleasant Long 43.03 West
under short sail at 12.30 stowed up to the N.E. by N. until
sun down hauled two on S.E. Tack shortened sail middle &
latter part of the same at 7.30 P.M. stowed up to
the N.E. by. set top sails

Remarks Sunday June 8 1890

Commenced with a fresh E.N.E. Tredos Wind and
light Tredos squalls more upon top sail fore sail stowing
N.E. until 6.30 a.m. hauled upon top sails hauled to the wind
on Starboard Tack middle went out do latter part
Went out the same set all possible sail at 6.00.
on the Wind on Starboard Tack by the Wind
heading N.E. by N. Lat. 16.05. North

Monday June 9 Long 45.19. West
Commenced with fresh E.N.E. Wind and some what
Baffling by the Wind heading N.E. by N. heading
middle and latter part went out the same heading
Course N. by E. Lat. 15.30 North

Tuesday June 10 Long 45.34 West
Commenced with nice all sail Breeze from N.E.
and some what Pleasant under all sail heading
Course N. by E. employed fitting New Blocks straps
to main Top sail railroads. middle & latter part
Went out the same heading Course N. by E.

Lat. 20.30. North

Wednesday June 11 Long 46.26 West
Came in nice all sail Breeze and Pleasant Weather
Wind a haul N.E. by E. with Baffling in the North. Course
N. by E. middle and latter part went out the same
Lat. 22.47. North

Thursday June 12 Long 47.41 West
Commenced with nice all sail Breeze from E. by N.
to N. by E. and Pleasant Weather employed painting
Blocks aloft and shepning some other light jobs
by the Wind heading N.E. by E. to N. by E. Course
N. by E. middle part went out the same
employed Bending New sails as main Top. gallant
sail lower main top sail at 8.00. Signialed an Austrian
Bark exchanged Longitudes 48.07 West Lat 24.48 North
laden Bound to New York steering N. by N.
