E. & and cloudy weather, steering by the wind to the East, under top sails courses and Libb, at sunset reefed the top sails. at sunrise saw a sail, wore ship to the N. E. W. at 6. A. M. spoke the ship Mount Walliston, of New Bedford, Loffin, Master, 34 days out Clear, Saw Fin backs, So Ends Lat 39.52. N.	Western Black Fish.	Islands, Augustus N. Perkins. Master Saturday July 10th 1858 barr. with moderate wind from the South and cloudy weather, heading S. E. E. by the wind under all sail; at 6.30. P. M. lowered three boats for blackfish, and the Larboard and waist Boats got two, at 8.30. got them on board, wore ship to the N. E. W. shortened sail and stood whole watches, at daylight made sail, saw a breach once but saw nothing more of it, took in the M. T. G. Sail, and double reefed the top sails, So Ends. Lat by Obs. 40.08. N. Long 35.22. West.
Breeze	Wednesday July 7th 1858 barr. with a brisk wind from the South under double reef, courses & steering by the wind to the N. E. W. at 9. P. M. wore ship to the E. S. E. middle part moderate latter part strong breeze under top sails & So Ends, Lat 39.58. N. Long by Chron. 38.38. W.	Strong Breeze	Sunday, July 11th 1858 barr. with a strong breeze from the South and rugged, heading N. E. W. under double reefed top sails, at 9. A. M. wore ship to the S. E. the wind S. E. W. latter part strong breeze, So Ends, Lat. 39.00. N. Long 35.04. West.
Moderate	Thursday, July 8th 1858 barr. with a strong breeze from the South to S. by W. steering by the wind to the E. S. E. under top sails, courses, & ship Mount Walliston in sight 10 miles off the larboard middle part moderate, at daylight made all sail, saw a sail, So Ends, Lat 39.18. N Longitude by Chronometer, 35.18. West.	Porpoises	Monday, July 12th 1858 barr. with a strong wind from the S. E. W. steering S. E. under short sail, at 9.30. P. M. Caught a Porpoise, middle part light wind at daylight boiled out the Blackfish, and made all sail, So Ends, Lat. 39.06. N. Long 33.14. W.
Humpbacks, Black Fish,	Friday, July 9th 1858 barr. with moderate wind from the South, with a head swell, heading S. E. E. by the wind with all sail out, saw two humpbacks at sunset took in sail, and set Boats crew watches, at daylight made sail, saw Black fish, lowered three boats, struck two, saved one to the waist Boat, at 6.45. A. M. took up the boats, So Ends, Lat 40.43. N. Long 32.44. W.	Whale Ropes	Tuesday, July 13th 1858 barr. with a light breeze from the N. E. W. and fine weather, steering S. E. with all sail out, saw two sails, latter part wind N. E. W. steering E. S. E. saw a sail, So Ends. Lat 38.20. N. Long 30.24. West.
		Fogal 	Wednesday, July 14th 1858 barr. with a light wind from the W. S. W. and fine weather, steered E. by S. by S. under all sail, until 13 o'clock, shortened sail and lay aback heading N. W. at 4. A. M. steered E. by S. rainey & squally, at 8. A. M. saw Fogal, Leb. Dist 20 miles. Wind N. E. So Ends, Lat 38.25. Long 29.18. W.
