 Thursday, July 15th 1858

 George Pauline,
 comm. with a brisk wind from the N.E.
 and clear weather, heading in shore
 under all sail, at 12.30. M. tacked to
 the N.N.W. at 3.30. P.M. George Pauline,
 saw sperm whales going very quick to the
 N.E.W. going so fast there was no chance
 to lower for them, at 7. P.M. tacked to the
 S.E. by E. tacked several times during the
 night, at 8. A.M. lowered a boat and
 the Captain went ashore at Fagal, so ends
 beating into the passage;

Recruiter,
 Friday July 16th 1858
 comm. with a light wind from the N.E.
 lying off and on the harbour, at 5. P.M.
 the boat returned with some Onions Pumpkin
 &c. shipped two men, and two deserted, stured
 S.E.W. middle part wind light, at daylight
 saw the land, saw a vessel boiling, so ends
 sturing S.p.W. Lat 37.36. N. Long 27.56. W.

Bainey,
 Saturday July 17th 1858
 comm. with a brisk wind from the N.E. &
 fine weather, sturing S.p.W. with all
 sail out, middle part strong breeze with
 showers of rain, latter part pleasant, wind
 S.E.W. stured S.E.W. Employed in breacking
 out between decks, saw three sails, so ends
 Lat by Obs. 38.18. N. Long none.

Ab. Sail,
 Sunday, July 18th 1858
 comm. with a moderate breeze from the N.E. &
 sturing S.E.W. under all sail, middle &
 latter parts pleasant, so ends. Lat 32.30. N.
 Long 26.20

Studding Sails,
 Monday July 19th 1858
 comm. with a gentle breeze from the N.E. and
 pleasant weather, sturing S.E.W. under all sail,
 latter part strong breeze, set lower & top mast studding sails.
 so ends. Lat 29.37. N. Long 26.02. W.

Sch of Fagal, Augustus N. Perkins, Master
 Tuesday July 20th 1858
 Strong Breezes
 comm. with a strong breeze from the N.E.
 and cloudy weather, sturing S.E.W. under
 all sail, middle part moderate, latter part
 brisk breeze, so ends. Lat 26.39. N. Long 26.22. W.

Wednesday July 21st 1858
 Strong Breezes
 comm. with a strong breeze from the N.E.
 sturing S.E.W. under all sail, at 9. P.M. took
 in the Staysails & Main Royal, middle &
 latter parts strong trades saw nothing, so ends.
 Lat by Obs. 25.15. N. Long 26.38. West.

Thursday July 22nd 1858
 Fore. Braces,
 comm. with strong trades, sturing S.E.W.
 with studding sails out, middle & latter
 parts strong trades, so ends. Lat 19.41. S. Long 26.40. W.

Friday July 23rd 1858
 Schooners,
 comm. with strong trade and cloudy
 weather, sturing S.E.W. by W. all sail
 out, at 3.40. P.M. saw a whaling schooner,
 sturing East, middle part moderate, latter
 part the wind light pointed the Larboard
 Boat, so ends. Lat. 16.36. N. Long. 26.12. W.

Saturday July 24th 1858
 Scraping Masts,
 comm. with light trade and cloudy weather
 sturing South under all sail, middle &
 latter parts light airs, saw a sail in the
 N.N.E. so ends, the watch scraping the
 masts, Lat by Obs. 15.10. N. Long none.

Sunday July 25th 1858
 Pointing Boats,
 comm. with light airs from N.N.E. to
 S.E., sturing S.E.W. under all sail, lowered
 the Boats for exercise, middle & latter
 parts light winds, saw a ship bound
 to the North, so ends. Lat. 14.20. N. Long 26.45. W.
