Lat by Obs. 2.21 N. Long 24.36. West.	Wednesday August 11th 1858 Finbacks. land with gentle trade and fair weather, by the wind under all sail, heading from S. by W. to S. W. saw a Finback, middle part brisk trade, latter squally and rainy, do Ends. Lat by Obs. 10.57. S. Long 30.31. West.
Pleasant,	Friday August 6th 1858 land with a moderate breeze from the S. by W. and pleasant weather, heading W. by S. under all sail, at 6. P.M. took in the staysail and tacked to the E. by S. at 4. P.M. tacked back to the S. W. latter part brisk wind and clear, do Ends. Lat 1.04 N. Long 25.38.	Thursday August 12th 1858 Squally. land with a strong breeze from the E. S. E. attended with squalls of wind and rain, double reefed the top sails, heading from South to S. W. by S. middle part squally, latter part better weather, saw a breach, do Ends. Lat 12.38. S. Long 30.53. West.
Tarring,	Saturday August 7th 1858 land with brisk wind from the S. E. E. and pleasant weather, heading S. W. with all sail out, middle and latter parts fine weather, the watch tarring down, do Ends. Lat 1.15. S. Long 26.46. W.	Friday August 13th 1858 Gulls. land with brisk trade heading S. by W. under whole top sails, & middle part moderate, fitted cutting gages, latter part strong trade, broke out meat, do Ends. Lat by Obs. 15.12. S. Long 31.01. West.
Trades,	Sunday August 8th 1858 land with a brisk wind from S. E. to S. E. by E. under all sail by the wind to the S. by W. and S. S. W. middle and latter parts strong trade, a sail in sight, do Ends. Lat 4.03. S. Long 27.23. W.	Saturday August 14th 1858 Water. land with strong trade and cloudy, heading S. by W. with M. F. G. sail and flying jib, out, middle and latter parts light winds from the E. N. E. to N. N. E. broke out water, stowed South, do Ends. Lat by Obs. 17.17. S. Long 30.30. West.
Anchors,	Sunday August 9th 1858 land with brisk trade and fair weather heading S. S. W. to S. W. under all sail, except staysails, middle and latter parts wind light and variable, from South to S. E. gave new main top sail, braces, do Ends. Lat 6.26. S. Long 28.32. W.	Sunday August 15th 1858 Royal yard. land with light winds from the E. N. E. and pleasant weather, stowing S. S. E. under all sail, at 4. P.M. the wind North, sent down the main royal yard, and fitted a temporary one, middle and latter parts light weather, stowing S. by E. wind North, do Ends. Lat by Obs. 18.38. S. Long 30.09.15. W.
Sugar,	Tuesday August 10th 1858 land with light trade. Stowed by the wind to the S. S. W. with all sail out, middle and latter parts strong trade, packed the Anchors, saw two Vails, started a cask of sugar, and beans, do Ends. Lat 8.42. S. Long 29.37. West.
