

Ship Plover, of New Bedford, towards
Monday August 16th 1858
All Sail, hauled with a light breeze from the N.W.
and pleasant weather, steering S. by E
under all sail, except the Fore & Mizzen
top gallant sails, at 5.30 the wind S.W. by W.
and cloudy, took in the studding sails,
and braced up, middle and latter parts
light airs, saw a sail, so Ends. Lat 19.12.5. Long 28.31

Tuesday, August 17th 1858
Bread, hauled with light airs from the South to S.W.
under all sail, at 4. P. M. boarded the Danish
Barque King of Denmark, 65 days from Calcutta
bound to France, sent letters by her, middle
and latter parts brisk winds from the S.W.
with a heavy swell running from the
South, broke out for bread, and water,
so Ends. Lat 19.52. S. Long. 27.52. West

Wednesday, August 18th 1858
Swell, hauled with brisk winds from the S. S.W.
with a heavy swell running from the
South, under all sail heading S. E. by E
at dark shortened sail, at 7. A. M. made
sail, saw three sails, steering N. E., latter
part saw lots of Pinbacks so Ends Lat 20.16.5
Long 26.18.

Thursday August 19th 1858
Swell, hauled with a brisk wind from the South
to S. S.W. with a heavy swell, the ship heading
from East to E. S. E. under all sail except
the Fore & Mizzen top gallant sails, saw two
sails, were ship to the S.W. middle and
latter parts heading South, wind N. E. saw ^{Lat, hum, latter} no. Ends.

Friday August 20th 1858
Pinbacks, hauled with brisk winds from the N.E. and flouzy
steering S. by W. all sail out, saw Pinbacks, middle
and latter parts strong breeze from the N.W.E.
so Ends Lat by Obs. 24.06.5. Long by Chron. 25.00 W.

Saturday, August 21st 1858
Gale, hauled with a strong breeze from the N.W.E. and cloudy
weather, steering S. by E all sail out, fixed the
Pendants, Lib and Stay sail pendants, middle part squally,
took in the studding sails, saw a Barque
steering to the N.E. at 10. A.M. took a squall of
wind from the S.W. and shifted sudden to
the N.E. shortened sail to a Fore sail & close
reefed Mizzen top sail, and Main Spencer, raining
and blowing a moderate gale, the wind S.E. by E.
so Ends.

Sunday, August 22nd 1858
Gale, hauled with a strong gale from the S. S.E. and
raining, the ship under short sail, heading East,
middle and latter parts blowing a gale reefed
the Fore sail so Ends, no sun observed.

Monday, August 23rd 1858
Gale, hauled with a strong gale from the S. S.E. heading
E. by N. and E. N.E. under close reefed Main top
sails &c at 12. midnight were ship to the South
at 5. A.M. made sail, latter part moderate wind
N.E. steering S. by W. so Ends. Lat 26.34.5. no Long.

Tuesday August 24th 1858
Rain, hauled with strong wind from the N.E. by N. with
thick rainy weather, steering S. by W. under double
reef. & Courses, at sunset furled the Main sail,
and Mizzen top sail, and close reefed the others,
middle part more moderate, the wind N.W. by W.
made same sail, latter part squally, at 11.45 A.M.
had a very hard squall of wind and rain from
South, took in every thing except Spencer &
Stay sail, so Ends. sun Obscured.

Wednesday August 25th 1858
Hard, hauled with a strong gale from the S. S.E. and clear
weather, heading East under Main Spencer & Stay sail,
at 4. P.M. moderate set the Fore sail & close reefed top sails.
sent down Miz. T. yard latter part pleasant, so Ends Lat 28.01.5. Long 25.42.30 W.
