

Ship Flower, of New Bedford, off Port

Friday October 15<sup>th</sup> 1858

Main Sail. Calm with light winds from the S. W. under short sail, repairing the main sail, at 4 P. M. bent the main sail, at sunset shortened sail, middle part squally, at sunrise made same sail, heading East, latter part strong breeze, so Ends. Lat 23.12. S. Long 55.05. Lunar 5510.8

Saturday October 16<sup>th</sup> 1858

Pleasant. Calm with strong trade and rugged, heading East, under short sail, at sunset took in sail, at daylight made sail, latter part moderate, so Ends. Lat by Obs. 23.06. S. Long 55.35. Lunar 5521

Sunday October 17<sup>th</sup> 1858

Land. Calm with moderate trade heading S. E. by N. made all sail, the first time for 53 days, saw the land and a sail, at 4 P. M. tacked to the South, at sunset shortened sail, middle and latter parts pleasant weather, tacked several times under all sail, saw Bonbours, so Ends. Lat 21.52. S. Long 55.29 E.

Monday, October 18<sup>th</sup> 1858

Pleasant. Begins with light trade and fine weather, under all sail beating to windward, saw a merchant vessel, at sunset shortened sail, heading S. by W. Bonbours dist 35 miles, at daylight made sail, saw two sails, at 7.30 A. M. stowed W. by S. latter part wind light, so Ends. Lat by Obs. 22.01. South no sights.

Tuesday October 19<sup>th</sup> 1858

Painting Boats. Calm with light trade, stowing W. S. W. under all sail, saw a sail, at sunset shortened sail, to a close reefed Main top sail, middle part brisk trade, at sunrise made all sail and stowed W. by S. Saw a sail, so Ends, painting the Boats &c. Lat by Obs. 22.38. S. Long 53.35. E.

Wednesday October 20<sup>th</sup> 1858

Pleasant. Calm with moderate trade and fine weather stowing W. S. W. under all sail, at sunset took in sail, at daylight made sail and stowed W. by S. Saw a sail, so Ends, painting Boats. Lat by Obs. 23.12. S. Long by Lho. 52.00. East.

Thursday October 21<sup>st</sup> 1858

Rainey. Calm with brisk trade stowing W. S. W. under short sail, at sunset took in sail, and heaved by the wind to the S. E. middle part strong trade and squally, latter part rainey & squally, unbent the spanker to repair it so Ends. Lat by Obs. 23.45. S. Long 51.28. East.

Friday October 22<sup>nd</sup> 1858

Squally. All these 24 hours strong winds from the N. E. and squally the ship under short sail stowing to the West and N. W. saw nothing, bent the spanker, so Ends. Lat by Obs. 23.42. S. Long by Lho. 50.30. East.

Saturday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> 1858

Finbacks. The first and middle parts pleasant weather, the wind from North to S. W. shortened and made sail, stowed S. W. and N. S. W. saw a poor Finback, so Ends with squally weather. Lat 23.51.

Sunday October 24<sup>th</sup> 1858

Rainey. Calm with squally rainey weather the wind from the South, shortened sail to a main top sail, heading S. S. E. middle part moderate heading to the West, at sunrise made same sail, and wore ships to the W. S. W. latter part strong trade saw nothing, so Ends. Lat 24.56. S. Long 51.02. E.

Monday, October 25<sup>th</sup> 1858

Squally. Calm with strong trade and rugged, wore ships to the N. E. under short sail, at sunset took in sail heading S. S. E. middle part squally, at sunrise made sail and stowed W. S. W. took out water so Ends, fine weather, Lat 24.16. S. Long 50.52. E.
