Eugenia & steering to the N. N. W. spoke the Messenger
Messenger, shortened sail, at daylight made sail &
got a Boat from the Messenger, steered
off N. N. W. and spoke the Bark Eugenia,
and then ~~Brewster~~ of Mattapoiset Wait
I. Brewster Master 18 months out, 550. sperm, so Ends.
Lat. by Obs. 25. 01. S. Long 48. 50. East.

Tuesday, November 16th 1858
Fore Sail, band. with strong trade heading to the S. E
the Brewster in company, at sunset took
in sail, at daylight made sail and wore
ship to the North, so Ends, mending an old
Fore Sail, Lat 25. 20. S. Long 48. 45. East.

Wednesday, November 17th 1858
I. trader, band. with a strong breeze from E. S. E
heading to the E. S. E Brewster in company,
at sunset took in sail, at daylight made
same sail, saw three sails, latter part
more moderate, saw Pinbacks, so Ends.
Lat by Obs. 25. 37. S. Long 51. 06 East.

Thursday, November 18th 1858
Provisions, band. with brisk winds from the S. E and
fair weather, heading to the S. E under
short sail, mending an old Fore sail, at
sunset took in sail, middle part calm, at
daylight made same sail heading N. W.
latter part rainey, broke out water & butter,
so Ends, no Observation, sun Obscure,

Friday November 19th 1858
Rainey, band. with light airs from the E. S. E attended
with rain, heading North under short
sail, at 4. P. M. clear, saw a sail to the
N. E, middle and latter parts pleasant,
repairing the Old Fore Sail, broke out meat,
so Ends, Lat 23. 27. S. Long 50. 55. East.

Tauphan. Augustus N. Perkins. Master.
Saturday November 20th 1858
Pheasant, band. with fine pleasant weather, steering
west under all sail, middle part under short
sail, steering West, at daylight made sail,
latter part heavy weather with fine rain &
thunder, so Ends no Obs. Sun Obscure,

Sunday November 21st 1858
Boat, band. with a strong breeze from the East, and
cloudy weather, steered N. by S. under double
reefs, at 3. 45. P. M. saw a boat, at 4. P. M. boarded
a boat and went to the boat and brought
it along side, it proved to be a yacal Boat
of Six Oars, with a Carps in it a white man
as we found by the hair in the Boat, there
was one Oar in her and her rudders, let her go
again, and steered S. W. at sunset shortened
sail, heading East, at daylight made same
sail, latter part strong breeze, steered N. N. W.
so Ends. Lat by Obs. 24. 38. S. Long 48. 48. East.

Monday, November 22nd 1858
P. Pacific band. with brisk winds from the N. E. and cloudy
steering N. W. at 6. 30. P. M. spoke the Pacific, shortened
sail heading East, middle and latter parts pleasant
saw three sails, so Ends, Lat 24. 42. S. Long 49. 05. E.

Tuesday November 23rd 1858
Pacific Bell, band. with a gentle breeze from the S. E and
Mysenger, fine weather, spoke the Pacific, Bell, & Mysenger,
at sunset shortened sail, middle part light wind
heading to the S. E, at daylight saw three sails,
made same sail and steered N. S. W. saw
Pinbacks & grass pupes, so Ends. Lat 25. 26. S. Long 48. 46. 30 E.

Wednesday, November 24th 1858
Gaskets, band. with a strong breeze, under double reefs.
steering N. W. with cloudy weather, at sunset
shortened sail, heading S. by W. at daylight
made same sail, latter part strong breeze under short
sail, making burnt gaskets, Lat 25. 03. S. Long 48. 09. E.
