

Ship Plover, of New Bedford, cruising off
 Thursday, November 25th 1858
 Rugged, hant. with a strong breeze from the E. N. E. and
 rugged, heading to the North under very short
 sail, saw the Pacific, at sunset reefed down
 and wore ship to the S. E. at daylight made
 same sail blowing fresh, so Ends. Lat 24. 59. S.
 Long 48. 12. E.

Friday November 26th 1858
 Marthas Pacific's Brewster, All three 24 hours strong winds from the E. N. E.
 shorted and made sail, wore ship several
 times, spoke the Brewster, saw the Pacific &
 the Marthas, so Ends. Lat 24. 59. S. Long 48. 37. E.

Saturday, November 27th 1858
 B. Pacific Throughout these 24 hours, brisk trades, shorted
 and made sail, and tacked several times,
 spoke the Pacific, and saw two other sails.
 so Ends. Lat 24. 52. S. Long 48. 59. East.

Sunday, November 28th 1858
 Whaling, hant. with brisk winds and fair weather.
 spoke the Pacific, at 5 P. M. saw Boats after
 a while, saw the whale and lowered for
 him and Mr. Hood, mate of the Pacific, struck
 the whale and got stores, and Mr. Joseph, got
 stores, at 8 P. M. got the whale along side of
 the Pacific, was were mated with her,
 at daylight sent a Boat crew on board to help
 to cut, so Ends, Lat 25. 03. Long 48. 25. East.

Monday, November 29th 1858
 B. Pacific hant. with a gentle breeze from the S. E. and
 fair weather, with Mr. T. G. sail out, at 5 P. M.
 the Captain boarded the Pacific, as she finished
 cutting, at sunset shorted sail and let the
 Pacific have a boat, at 7 A. M. took 48 barrels
 of coals on board to put oil in, put a new
 Boat out on the waist cranes, and made
 sail heading N. N. E. repairing the Bow Boat
 and davits, so Ends, Lat 25. 25. S. Long 48. 32. E.

Port Laupham, Augustus N. Perkins, Master.
 Tuesday, November 30th 1858
 Alb. Sail, hant. with brisk winds from the E. S. E. and
 Chop. ply, under to the N. E. under top sails, at 5
 P. M. double reefed, and tacked to the South,
 at sunset took in more sail and tacked to
 N. E. Pacific in sight boiling, at daylight
 made same sail and staved to the S. W.
 saw two sails, latter part fine weather under
 all sail, so Ends. Lat 24. 29. S. Long 48. 32. East.

Wednesday, December 1st 1858
 Jumps, hant. with fine weather, wind East, heading
 N. W. and West, under all sail, saw three sails
 at 6 P. M. boarded the Pacific, and they saw
 spouts, came on board again, and run
 for them but they were only Jumps, at
 sunset took in sail, and wore ship to the S. E.
 at daylight made all sail and wore ship to
 the N. W. saw three sails, so Ends, repairing the
 Bow Boat, Lat 24. 59. S. Long 48. 23. East.

Thursday, December 2nd 1858
 B. Pacific B. Iowa, hant. with pleasant weather under all sail,
 wind from the E. N. E. at sunset spoke the
 Pacific and the Bark Iowa, 35 months out
 900. Sperm 1000 humpbacks, at daylight wore
 ship to the North, and boarded the Pacific,
 so Ends, Lat 25. 20. S. Long 48. 28. East.

Friday, December 3rd 1858
 B. Pacific, hant. with a light breeze from the N. W. staving
 to the S. E. in company with the Pacific.
 at sunset took in sail, latter part squally,
 and rainy, wind E. N. E. saw two sails,
 shipped 48 barrels of Sperm Oil by the Pacific,
 so Ends. Lat. 25. 15. South, no sights.

Saturday December 4th 1858
 Squally, All these 24 hours changeable under short sail
 heading different ways. so Ends. Lat. 24. 54. S.
 Long 48. 00. East.
