Watches,	hauled with a brisk breeze from the S.E. and clear weather, heading E by S. by the wind under all sail, at sunset furled the light sails and double reefed, and stood Sea watches, middle and latter parts strong breeze, So Ends. Lat, 30. 41. S. Long, 104. 26 E.	Squally, hauled with a light air from the South to S.E. W. heading S. E. to E. S. E. under all sail, at 4 P.M. the wind hauled to S.W. at 10. P.M. Squally, took in sails, So Ends. Lat 34. 00. S. Long 103. 53 East
Rugged,	Wednesday, January 26 th 1859 hauled with a strong breeze from the S.E. & the ship under close reefs & fore sail, heading East, at sunset wore ship to the S. W. middle and latter parts blowing strong, heading S. S. W. and S. W. under close reefs. So Ends. Lat 30. 08. S. Long 103. 33. 30 E	Gale, hauled with a strong gale from the S.E. W. and squally, heading S. E. under short sail, at sunset took in the fore sail & fore top sail, middle part squally, at 8. A.M. wore ship to the west, blowing strong, So Ends. Lat 34. 40. S. Long, none.
Spencer,	Thursday, January 27 th 1859 hauled with a strong breeze from the S. E. & and rugged, heading from S. E. W. to S. W. under close reefs & courses, middle part more moderate, unbent the Main Spencer and cut it off on the foot, latter part better weather, bent the spencer, So Ends, 31. 31. S 102. 21 E	Rugged, hauled with a strong gale from the South and rugged heading from West. W. S. W. under close reefed main top sail, & spencer, at 3. P.M. wore ship to the E. S. E. and made some sails, the weather moderating, middle and latter parts, under courses & double reefs, broke out water, mofas, & hams, & meal, So Ends. Lat 34. 11. S. Long 105. 33. East
Phasant,	Friday, January 28 th 1859 hauled with a moderate breeze from the S. E. and cloudy weather heading S. W. and S. S. W. under all sail, at 3. 30. P.M. tacked to the East, at 6. 30 tuck in the M. T. G. Sail, and tacked to the S. E. W. middle and latter parts light weather, wind baffling, lowered a boat & scrubbed the benches, So Ends, setting up hooks, Lat, 33. 47. S. Long 101. 40. East	Light Winds, hauled with brisk winds from the S. E. W. & cloudy weather with passing squalls of rain, heading S. E. under moderate sail, middle and latter parts moderate, So Ends, 35. 00. S. 107. 12. E
Cleaned the Iron work,	Saturday, January 29 th 1859 hauled with a light wind from the S. E. & and fair weather, under all sail heading S. W. cleaned the windrops, and the Iron work, so Ends these 24 hours, Lat 33. 28. S Long none, no sights,	Light weather hauled with light winds from the S. E. W. and cloudy weather, heading S. E. under all sail, middle & latter parts, winds N. W. staved S. E. by S. So Ends. Lat 36. 24. S. Long 107. 12. East
		Squally, hauled with a gentle breeze from the N. W. and fine weather, staving S. E. by S. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, middle part, squally & rainey, at 4. 30. Hoisted up the main top sail, the wind N. E. W. latter part strong wind and clear, So Ends. Lat by Obs. 36. 55. S. Long 100. 01. East,
