Saturday, February 5th 1859
 land. with a strong breeze from the N.W. and
 clear weather, steering S. by E. under two
 close reefed top sails, and Fore sails
 at 3. P. M. shook the reefs out of the main
 top sail, and set the M. T. G. sail, at 5. P. M.
 steered S. by E., at 7. shortened sail to a Fore
 sail, & close reefed main top sail, at
 12 midnight squally and rainey blowing
 am, sent down the M. T. G. yard, and
 took in the Fore sail, and main top sail,
 and set the spencers, the wind N.W. latter
 part blowing hard, wind N. S. W. so Ends.
 Lat by Obs. 36. 57. South, no sights.

Sunday, February 6th 1859
 land. with a strong gale from the S. W. with
 a heavy sea, heading N. N. W. under spencers
 at 6. P. M. more moderate set the main top
 sail, at 12. midnight set the Fore sail,
 and Fore top sail, steered East, latter part
 wind light, so Ends. Lat 36. 22. S. Long 113. 28 E

Heaving the
 Iron work,

Monday, February 7th 1859
 land. with a light wind from the N. S. W. and cloudy
 weather, steered E. by S. under short sail, saw a large
 English Clipper, steering N. by W. middle & latter
 parts pleasant weather, wind S. W. shaned &
 painted the Iron work, repaired the M. T. G.
 sail, so Ends. Lat 35. 56. S. Long 113. 38 E

Tuesday, February 8th 1859
 land. with a light wind from the S. E. W. and fair
 weather, steering E. N. E. under top sails & Fore sail
 at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail,
 heading E. by S. blowing strong, from S. E. repaired
 the main top G. sail, at 12. noon wore ship to
 the South, so Ends. Lat by Obs. 35. 11. S. Long 114. 46 E

Wednesday, February 9th 1859
 land. with a strong breeze from the S. E. and
 rugged, heading S. S. W. under close reefs. Fore
 sail & at 3. P. M. took in the Fore top sail, middle
 part squally, took in the Fore sails, at 2. 30. A. M. set
 it again, at daylight made more sail, heading
 E. by S. so Ends. Lat 35. 35. S. Long 114. 29. East,

Thursday, February 10th 1859
 land. with a strong breeze from the S. E. and cloudy
 weather, heading East & E. by S. under close reefs &
 Sibs, and courses, at sunset took in sail, middle
 part moderate, tacked twice during the night,
 at sunrise made some sail, at 10. 30. A. M. took
 in sail to a close reefed main top sail, blowing
 a gale from South, wore ship to the West
 hove too, Lat by Obs. 35. 36. S. Long 114. 48. East,

Friday February 11th 1859
 land. with a strong gale from South and a
 heavy sea, heading N. by S. hove too, at 4. P. M.
 more moderate, set the Fore sail, at daylight
 wore ship to the South, the wind N. by S.
 latter part, under courses, and close reefs, &
 so Ends, saw a merchant Barque, Lat, 36. 58. S. 114. 35

Strong Breeze.

Saturday, February 12th 1859
 land. with a strong breeze from the N. S. W. with
 a heavy swell, heading S. by W. under short
 sail, middle and latter part moderate
 made sail, scraped down the masts &
 so Ends. Lat by Obs. 36. 21. S. Long 114. 39. East,

Sunday, February 13th 1859
 land. with a light wind from the S. E. W. and
 cloudy weather, steering N. N. W. under whole top
 sails & at 4. P. M. shifted the main top sails
 at 11. P. M. steered N. by W. at daylight made
 sail, wind S. E. and pleasant weather,
 so Ends. Lat, 35. 09. S. Long 114. 37. East,
