Sunday, February 27 th 1859	
Liberty.	All these 24 hours baffling winds and rainy weather the watch on liberty. So Ends.
Monday, February 28 th 1859	
Watering.	All these 24 hours light winds from East to S. E. and pleasant weather, Employed in getting water & recruits, the watch on liberty. So Ends.
Tuesday, March 1 st 1859	
Liberty.	All these 24 hours, light winds from the South and fine weather, one watch on liberty, the other stowing down water, &c. So Ends.
Wednesday, March 3 rd 1859	
Liberty.	All these 24 hours pleasant weather, the watch on liberty, the other getting off recruits &c. So Ends, these 24 hours.
Thursday, March 3 rd 1859	
Liberty.	land with brisk winds from the S. E. and some rain, latter part sharp lightning & heavy thunder, the watch on liberty, the other stowing wood and water &c. So Ends.

Friday March 4 th 1859	
Liberty.	All these 24 hours light land breezes and fine weather, the watch on liberty the other, cleaning Ship V. Sailed Barques Kather, & Enos.
Saturday, March 5 th 1859	
Liberty.	All these 24 hours light winds from the S. W. and fair weather, painting V. the watch on liberty.
Sunday, March 6 th 1859	
Liberty.	All this day light pleasant weather the watch on liberty, the other stowing wood &c. So Ends.
Monday, March 7 th 1859	
Desertion.	All this day light weather, the watch employed in various jobs, the other watch on liberty, John Garp, deserted, So Ends.
Tuesday, March 8 th 1859	
Liberty.	All these 24 hours light winds from the S. E. to East, one watch on liberty, the other employed in stowing down wood &c. So Ends.
Wednesday, March 9 th 1859	
Liberty Stop.	All this day, light pleasant weather painting the boats &c. the watch on liberty stop.
Thursday, March 10 th 1859	
Main Sail.	All these 24 hours dark hazy weather, John Garp, returned and Charles Nichols, repaired the Main Sail. So Ends.
Friday March 11 th 1859	
Rainy.	Throughout these 24 hours the wind from the N. E. to N. W. with rain thunder & lightning, So Ends, doing nothing.
Saturday, March 12 th 1859	
Rainy.	land with light winds from the S. W. and rainy got all ready for sea, latter part pleasant wind S. E. So Ends. in the vapor
