Sunday, March 13th 1858

All ready
for Sea.

All these 24 hours fresh breeze from the S. E. to East. all ready for Sea. So Ends.

Under way,

Monday, March 14th 1858

Land with a fresh breeze from the East, and pleasant weather, at 5 A. M. got under way, under all sail, and stowed S. W. by W. at 8 A. M. unbent the chains & stowed them below, stowed the Anchors, & at 12 noon the land out of sight, So Ends. Lat by Obs. 33. 30. S. Long 114. 30. East

Tempest,

Tuesday, March 15th 1858

Land with a fresh breeze from the E. S. E. and fair weather, steering N. N. W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, middle part sharp lightning and heavy thunder, & rain, at 7 A. M. luffed to the wind under a close reefed main top sail, at 8 A. M. steered N. N. W. blowing strong, So Ends. Lat. 32. 58. South.

S. Boat,

Wednesday, March 16th 1858

Land with a strong breeze from the South and rugged, steering N. N. W. under short sail, middle part moderate, at daylight took in the Starboard Boat, to repair her, made all sail and steered to the N. W. by W. So Ends. Lat. 32. 25. S. Long 110. 55. East.

Painting

Thursday, March 17th 1858

Land with a gentle breeze from the S. by W. and fine weather, heading N. W. by W. under all sail, at 5. 30. P. M. saw several Finbacks, painted the Starboard Boat, shortened sail, at daylight made sail, at 8. 30. A. M. took in all sail but main top sail & fore sail, had a squall of wind and rain, latter part strong breeze under short sail, saw a Sail, So Ends. Lat 31. 24 S. Longitude by Chronometer, 110. 15. East.

Friday, March 18th 1858

Sail mending,

Land with strong winds from the S. E. W. and clear, heading S. W. under very short sail, at sunset took in the fore top sail, middle & latter parts, light air from the S. W. repaired the old main top sail, So Ends. Lat 30. 59. South.

Shifted topails,

Saturday, March 19th 1858

Begins with a light air from the S. W. and fine weather, at 4. P. M. shifted the main top sails, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made all sail, latter part fine weather heading to the N. W. saw grampuses, So Ends. Lat 30. 46. S. 108. 32

All Sail,

Sunday, March 20th 1858

Land with a light wind from the S. E. W. with a bad swell from S. W. steering N. W. by S. under all sail, at sunset took in sail, luffed by the wind to the west, at daylight made all sail, and steered N. W. wind S. E. saw Blackfish & killers, So Ends. Lat. by Obs. 30. 12. S. Long 108. 38. East.

Provisions,

Monday, March 21st 1858

Begins with a gentle breeze from the S. E. and fair weather, steering N. W. under all sail, saw a Sail to the N. W. saw Killers & at sunset shortened sail, steering N. W. at 10. P. M. luffed by the wind to the S. W. at daylight made all sail and steered N. N. W. So Ends. Lat 32. 11 S. 108. 00

Painting Boats,

Tuesday, March 22nd 1858

Land with brisk wind from the S. E. E. and cloudy weather, steering N. N. W. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, and luffed to the S. W. at sunrise made sail and steered North, latter part moderate, steered North, painted the Starboard boat inside, saw nothing, So Ends. Lat by Obs. 38. 30. South, Long by Chron. 107. 46. East.
