Strong Breeze,	land. with moderate trades with a swell from the S.W., heading N. by E. at 1 P.M. stowed M. S. W. and made all sail, at 2 P.M. luffed by the wind to S.W. at 4 P.M. tacked to the Eastward, saw a sail in the weather bow at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail and wore ship to the west, with a strong breeze and hazy weather, so Ends, Lat. 26.33. S. Long. 107.59
Strong Breeze,	Tuesday, April 5 th 1859
	Begins with a strong breeze from the S. E. W. and hazy weather, heading S. E. under short sail, at sunset the wind hauled to S. E. & wore ship to the S. W. under close reefed main top sail and spencers, at daylight made some sail, latter part rugged, saw a sail, so Ends, Lat. 36.34. S. Long. by thro. 107.44.30 East,
B. Oriole,	Wednesday April 6 th 1859
	land. with strong trade and rugged, tacked ship to the East, and shook the reefs out of the Fore & Main top sails, at 4 P.M. double reefed the Fore one & spoke the Barque Oriole, of Fairhaven, Mitchell, Master, 31. months out 850. Spers. m. at sunset took in sail, heading East, at 9.30. parted company, at daylight wore ship to the S. W. and set double reefs 1/2. so Ends, Lat. 26.31. S. Long. 107.47. East,
S. Breeze,	Thursday, April. 7 th 1859
	Begins with a strong breeze from the S. E. & rugged, under double reefs &c heading S. W. by S. at sunset took in sail, at sunrise made some sail, saw the Hattlem & another sail, latter part better weather wore ship to the N. E., so Ends. Lat 27.15. S.
B. Hattlem	Friday April 8 th 1859
	The first and middle parts brisk trade heading to the N. E., latter part heading N. W. W. under short sail, spoke the Hattlem, so Ends. Lat 27.26. S. 107.31. E

Holland, Augustus N. Perkins, Master	Saturday April 9 th 1859
S. Breeze	land. with strong trades and rugged, under double reefs running N. W. at sunset took in sail, heading S. by W. at sunrise made some sail, stowed M. S. W. latter part blowing strong, at 12 noon luffed to the wind to N. E. by E. so Ends. Lat 27.10. S. Long 108.32. East,
S. Breeze	Sunday, April 10 th 1859
	Begins with strong trades and rugged, heading N. E. by E. under short sail, at sunset close reefed the Fore top sail, middle & latter parts blowing fresh, saw a Pinack, so Ends, Lat 26.29. S. Long. 106.10.15
Ship Richard Mitchell,	Monday April 11 th 1859
	land. with strong trades and rugged, heading E. N. E. under short sail, at daylight made sail, the weather more moderate, saw a sail and run for her, at 10. A. M. spoke the Ship Richard Mitchell of Edgar town, therefore master 28. months out 2400. M. 200 Spers. m. so Ends, Lat. 25.51. S. Long. 107.38. East,
Light Winds,	Tuesday, April 13 th 1859
	land. with brisk winds from the S. E. and cloudy, heading E. N. E. under top sails &c at sunset took in sail, at 8.30. P. M. parted company with the Mitchell at daylight made all sail, saw the R. Mitchell, latter part fine weather, so Ends. Lat. 25.23. S. 107.46
Light Wind,	Wednesday, April 13 th 1859
	land. with light pleasant weather, under all sail, saw two sails, latter part calm, so Ends Lat by Obs 35.51 S. Long by thro. 106.27. East,
Ship Abigail, R. Mitchell	Thursday, April 14 th 1859
	All three 24 hours light pleasant weather, spoke the Abigail & Mitchell, shortened & made sail, so Ends. Lat. 26.46. South,
