Friday May 20th 1859

Begins with strong trade and rugged weather heading E. by E. under short sail, sent down the Old Fore sail and cut it off, at sunset wore ship to S.W. and shortened sail, middle and latter parts blowing strong, under short sail, the M. Smith in company, so ends. Lat by Obs. 23.59 S. Long, 106.46. East.

Hathlum,

Saturday May 21st 1859

All these 24 hours light pleasant weather saw three sails, spoke the Hathlum, steered N.E. under all sail, so ends. Lat 24.06. Long 106.36 E.

Mechanick
M. Smith,

Sunday May 22^d 1859

All this day light pleasant weather, under all sail, spoke the Bark. Mechanick 750. 350 S. & W. spoke the M. Smith, so ends. Lat. 23.32. S. Long 107.12.

B. E. Dunbar,

Monday May 23^d 1859

land with light trade heading to the East under all sail, at 4. P.M. spoke the B. Dunbar Lincoln master 870 man the out 350. S. at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made all sail, in company with the B. Dunbar, saw 4 sails, so ends. Lat, 23.13. S. Long 108.12. E

Tuesday May 24th 1859

All these 24 hours light pleasant weather, heading to the S.W. spoke the Martha, and the Almiras, Smith, master, 9. man the out 8 200. S. 200. whale oil, so ends. Lat 23.20 S. Long 108.00

Wednesday May 25th 1859

J. Almiras,

Begins with a brisk wind from W.S.W. heading N.W. under all sail, in company with the Almiras, at sunset took in sail, at 8. P.M. parted company, at daylight made sail, the wind strong, wore ship to the E.S.E. saw two sails, so ends. Lat, 22.47. S. Long by thro, 108.46. East.

J. Wind,

Thursday May 26th 1859

land with a fresh breeze from the South, and a heavy swell, heading E. by E. under double reef, at sunset took in sail, at sunrise made same sail, latter part strong breeze, so ends. Lat 23.29. S. Long 108.35

J. Almiras,

Friday May 27th 1859

Begins with moderate weather spoke the Almiras at sunset shortened sail, at sunrise made sail, steered S. E. W. under short sail, so ends. Lat, by Obs. 23.33. S. Long by thro, 108.38. East.

Fresh Breeze,

Saturday May 28th 1859

land with brisk wind from S. E. and cloudy weather, steering to the S. E. W. under short sail, at sunset took in sail, middle part moderate, at daylight made sail, saw the Almiras, so ends. Lat, 24.07. S. Long 109.35. East.

Gentle Breeze,

Sunday May 29th 1859

Begins with a gentle breeze from E.S.E. and fine weather, steered west under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at sunrise made sail, saw two sails, so ends, heading N.E. fine weather, Lat, 23.47. S. Long 109.38. East.

J. Almiras,

Monday May 30th 1859

Throughout these 24 hours brisk breeze from S. E. and fine weather, jammed with the Almiras & J. St. Robt. shortened and made sail, so ends. Lat 23.32. S. Long 108.03. E.
