Meaning	Saturday September 24 th 1859
Ship	came with brisk trade, and some rain squalls, middle part rainy & squally, latter part pleasant, sailed Ship Brewster, 700 T. all hands cleaning ship & setting up shacks, so ends.
Liberty	Sunday September 25 th 1859
Liberty	All these 24 hours brisk winds and squally, one watch on liberty, so ends.
Watering	Monday September 26 th 1859
Watering	light winds, all hands employed in watering and breaking out, so ends.
Painting	Tuesday September 27 th 1859
Painting	All hands employed in watering breaking out and painting ship, so ends.
Liberty	Wednesday September 28 th 1859
Liberty	got off a raft of water, sent the watch on liberty the other watch painting ship, so ends.
Liberty	Thursday September 29 th 1859
Liberty	One watch on liberty, the other stowing water and painting ship so ends.
Liberty	Friday September 30 th 1859
Liberty	One watch on liberty, the other watch painting ship and Boats, so ends.
Desertions	Saturday October 1 st 1859
Liberty	One watch on shore, the other painting Boats & John Darp, and John Holland, deserters.
Liberty	Sunday October 2 nd 1859
Liberty	all these 24 hours light pleasant weather, the watch on liberty, Ticeas Deserters, so ends.
Desertions	Monday October 3 rd 1859
Desertions	Fine weather, the watch on liberty Peter Riley Deserters, so ends.

Anchor	at Mauritius, A. N. Perkins. Master
Liberty	Tuesday October 4 th 1859
Liberty	came with brisk winds and some fine rain, middle & latter parts moderate, liberty, stop.
Watering	Wednesday October 5 th 1859
Watering	All these 24 hours brisk winds & fair weather, got off 60 barrels of water & some game, so ends.
Recruits	Thursday October 6 th 1859
Recruits	All these 24 hours strong breeze & squally, getting off recruits, so ends.
Recruits	Friday October 7 th 1859
Recruits	All these 24 hours fresh trade, getting off recruits, and getting ready for sea, so ends.
Waiting for men	Saturday October 8 th 1859
Waiting for men	All these 24 hours fresh trade, all ready for sea waiting for men, shipped 5 men, so ends.
Underway	Sunday October 9 th 1859
Underway	came with brisk trade & flancy, at 2 P.M. got under way for sea, sent a boat ashore for the captain, stowed the Anchors, & at 5 P.M. made sail & stowed N.E. at dark shortened sail, and stood whole watches, at daylight made same sail & stowed the cables below, stowed N.E. so ends. Lat by Obs. 19. 24 S. Long by Chron. 57. 38 East.
S. trade	Monday October 10 th 1859
S. trade	came with strong trade & cloudy weather, stowing N.E. under double reef & middle & latter part squally so ends. Lat by Obs. 17. 47 S. Long 58. 22 East.
Squally	Tuesday October 11 th 1859
Squally	The first & middle part strong trade & squally, under double reef, stowing N.E. & E. latter part made sail, saw a steamer, so ends. Lat 16. 08 S Longitude by Chronometer, 59. 38 East.
