

# Ship Dover of New Bedford, on the

Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup> 1859

Sail mending, haul with light baffling winds from West to N. N. W. and some rain, repaired the Sills & bent the Main top sail, middle & latter parts better weather, sail mending, so Ends Lat. 2.48.8.65.04

Wednesday, November 9<sup>th</sup> 1859

Sail mending, All these 24 hours a nice breeze from West, to N. N. W. steering to the S. W. under all sail, sail mending, shifted the Fore top sail, and repaired the other, so Ends Lat. 1.41 N. Long by Lho. 65.30. East.

Thursday, November 10<sup>th</sup> 1859

Sail mending, haul with a light breeze from the West & fair weather, heading S. S. W. by the wind under all sail, repaired the Fore sail, middle & latter parts brisk wind from West, so Ends Lat. 00.04.51.

Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup> 1859

Squally, haul with brisk wind from W. by S. and squally, heading S. by E under top sails & middle part heading S. W. latter part tacked to the N. N. W. so Ends, Lat. by Obs. 00.06.8. Long by Lunar 66.08.8

Saturday, November 12<sup>th</sup> 1859

Sail mending, All these 24 hours brisk winds from the S. W. by S. to S. W. by W. and squally, heading N. N. W. & N. W. split the Flying Sill & repaired it, so Ends, under top sails, Lat. 21. miles North, Long 65.41. East

Sunday, November 13<sup>th</sup> 1859

Brisk Breeze, All this day, brisk wind from S. W. by W. heading N. W. by W. under moderate sail, tacked to the South, so Ends, Lat 00.23. South Long 66.48. East.

Monday, November 14<sup>th</sup> 1859

Rainy, All these 24 hours, light winds and rainy, heading from S. S. E. to S. W. so Ends, Lat 1.30 S. no Long.

Tuesday November 15<sup>th</sup> 1859

Light & Rainy, haul with light winds from west to N. N. W. and rainy, heading from South to S. W. under all possible sail, middle part all sail, latter part heavy rain, saw a ship steering East, so Ends, Lat. 2.40.8. Long 67.19.8

Wednesday, November 16<sup>th</sup> 1859

Sail mending, Begins with light air from N. S. W. heading South, under all sail, middle part heading from S. E. to S. W. squally, at 9. A. M. unbutton the Miz top sail to repair it, so Ends, No Observation.

Thursday, November 17<sup>th</sup> 1859

Rainy, haul with a squall from S. E. & rain, steered N. N. W. and shortened sail, at 4. P. M. the wind light from the North, made some sail, middle part heading S. S. E. latter part tacked to the N. by S. the wind S. W. by S. so Ends, Lat 3.31. S. Long 67.38. East.

Friday, November 18<sup>th</sup> 1859

Brisk wind, haul with brisk winds from S. W. by S. and fair weather, steering W. by S. under all sail, except the Flying Sill & Miz top 2. Sails, middle part moderate made all sail, bent the Miz. top sail, steered West & W. by N. latter part N. N. W. so Ends, Lat 3.04.8.5.19

Saturday, November 19<sup>th</sup> 1859

All Sail, haul with a gentle breeze from the S. W. by W. and fair weather, heading N. N. W. under all sail, at 4. P. M. tacked to the South, at 11. P. M. tacked to the West. latter part light wind, so Ends, Lat 2.31. S. Long 64.19.8

Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup> 1859

Porpoises, All these 24 hours, light winds from S. S. W. to S. W. heading West & W. by S. under all sail, saw Porpoises, so Ends, Lat by Obs. 1.49. S. Long by Lho. 62.37. East

Monday, November 21<sup>st</sup> 1859

Fine weather, All these 24 hours gentle winds W. S. W. & fine weather, under all sail, tacked twice changed the Butt, so Ends, Lat by Obs. 1.59. S. Long by Lho. 62.28. East.
