

Ship Plover, of New Bedford, at
 Thursday, May 31st 1860

Mohille, Sbr. land, with a brisk wind from S. E. & fine weather, steering NW. by W. under all sail, at 3 P.M. saw the Salander of Mohillou, bearing NW. by W. 40 miles Dist. the Harvest in company, middle & latter parts light winds, the Salander in sight about 30 miles Dist. So Ends. Lat 13. 02. S.

Anchored
 at
 Johannak, Friday June 1st 1860
 land, with a light breeze from S. E. and pleasant weather, steering for Johannak, at 9 P.M. steered N. by W. under short sail, at daylight made all sail at 8 A.M. abreast of Saddle Island, the Harvest about 0 miles astern, at 11. 30 A.M. let go the Anchor in 7 fathoms of water in Johannak, So Ends. the Harvest off Saddle Island.

Liberty, Saturday June 2^d 1860
 All these 24 hours strong breeze off the land, sent the watch ashore & shifted some meat, So Ends in liberty.

Liberty, Sunday, June 3^d 1860
 All these 24 hours strong flues off the land, the watch on liberty, So Ends.

Liberty, Monday June 4th 1860
 All these 24 hours strong squalls of the land with fine rain, breaking out heads & setting up shocks &c So Ends.

Liberty, Tuesday June 5th 1860
 All these 24 hours brisk land breeze, got off 45 barrels of tarras, set up the Sibs & Flying Sibs stags, watch on liberty, So Ends.

Deserted, Wednesday June 6th 1860
 land, with a strong land breeze arrived the English Brig of war, Persian, of 16 guns, latter part good weather getting off tarras, Augustus Melman Deserted So Ends.

Johannak, At N. Perkins, Master,
 Thursday June 7th 1860

Liberty, All these 24 hours strong flues off the land, getting off recruit & the watch on liberty, So Ends.

Liberty, Friday June 8th 1860
 land, with nice pleasant weather, employed in various jobs, middle part rainy, latter part fine weather, the watch on liberty & 4 men sick, So Ends.

Liberty, Saturday June 9th 1860
 All these 24 hours, flues, the watch on liberty and four men sick So Ends, then 24 hours.

Liberty, Sunday June 10th 1860
 All these 24 hours, fine pleasant weather, the watch on shore, the four men sick and having the Doctor visit them twice a day, So Ends.

Liberty, Monday June 11th 1860
 All these 24 hours, fine weather liberty, stopt, the men still sick, an English steamer of war arrived & sailed again So Ends, then 24 hours.

Sick, Tuesday June 12th 1860
 All these 24 hours, pleasant weather, getting ready for sea, three men still sick, having the doctor twice a day, So Ends, then 24 hours.

Sick, Wednesday June 13th 1860
 All these 24 hours, fine weather, getting ready for sea, three men sick yet, So Ends.

Sick, Thursday, June 14th 1860
 All these 24 hours, fine pleasant weather, Sailed Bark Harvest, So Ends, already for sea.

Under way, Friday June 15th 1860
 land, with a fresh land breeze, Sailed the Brig of war Persian, at 8 A.M. got under way for sea, stowed the Anchors & stowed the tables, Saw a steamer & a ship found two Natives on board, So Ends.
