 Friday October 26th 1860
 Death. band. with light trades, all hands coopersing
 the Oil, at 8.40. P. M. while taking off the
 Main Hatch Richard S. Talbot fell down
 into the lower hold & broke the back of his
 skull and expired in 35 minutes he was 33 years
 and 36 days, so Ends, coopersing.

Buried. Saturday October 27th 1860
 Begins with fine pleasant weather at 4. P. M. took
 the corpse to the grave, 4. Boats & crews, & buried
 it in good shape with many mourn full hearts
 for our dear lost ship mate, middle & latter part
 pleasant so Ends, coopersing, Oil.

Liberty. Sunday, October 28th 1860
 All these 24 hours light pleasant weather at 7. A. M.
 sent the Larboard watch ashore, so Ends.

Deserted. Monday, October 29th 1860
 All these 24 hours pleasant weather, coopersing
 the Oil, William & Stanton & Edgar Larnes
 Deserted, so Ends, these 24 hours.

Coopersing. Tuesday, October 30th 1860
 band. with light pleasant weather coopersing the
 Oil, at 8.30 A. M. finished coopersing the Oil,
 washed the ship & so Latter part pleasant so Ends.

Watering. Wednesday, October 31st 1860
 All these 24 hours pleasant weather, watering,
 washing & painting ship, sent Tho. Ryan to
 the Hospital, so Ends.

Watering. Thursday November 1st 1860
 All this day, fine weather, getting water &
 painting, so Ends.

Watering. Friday November 2nd 1860
 All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather, sailed
 Bark. San Francisco, finished watering, so Ends.

Port of, Mauritius, A. N. Perkins, Masters
 Saturday November 3rd 1860
 Recruits. All these 24 hours, fine weather, getting off
 recruits & set up the Bobstay, so Ends.

Deserted. Sunday, November 4th 1860
 band. with fine weather sent George Pauline
 on liberty for 12 hours, William Luckhlane
 Henry Colford & George Pauline deserted, so Ends
 shipping them.

Shipping Men. Monday, November 5th 1860
 All these 24 pleasant weather, getting ready for sea
 and shipping men, got 6 barrels of Beef from shore
 so Ends. Put Danahoe Mr. Sean gear board the *Western Man*.

Waiting for Men. Tuesday, November 6th 1860
 All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather, all ready
 for sea, and waiting for men, Manuel, Boy, Hunter.

Sold Shocks. Wednesday, November 7th 1860
 All these 24 hours pleasant weather, shipping
 men & getting out shocks for the John A. Robt,
 so Ends.

Under Way. Thursday, November 8th 1860
 band. with light pleasant weather, all ready for
 sea, shipped 10 men, at 9.30. A. M. got under
 way, for sea, unbent the chains & towed them
 down below, & lashed the Anchors, so Ends.
 under all Sail steering S. W. no observation.

Auction. Friday November 9th 1860
 band. with brisk trades, heading South E. S. E.
 Main top g. Sail out, at 4. P. M. sold Richard S. Talbot's
 clothes & chest at Auction which sold for 65 dollars,
 sold all the runaways effects at Auction, middle
 part rainey, under short sail, latter part pleasant
 under all sail, so Ends. Lat. 21.00 South,
