Sailed with a moderate breeze from the S.E. at
3 P.M. spoke the *Almira* 1000 S. 400 W. 28 months
out, at 5 P.M. spoke the *Pamelia*, 1000 S. 19th
months, 500 Sperm, boiling, at sunset took in
sails, & stood to the Eastward, at 4 A.M. wore
ship to the S. S. W. Saw three sails, latter part
strong breeze, So Ends, Lat. 24.47. S. Long 49.00 E

Thursday, December 13th 1860

Thy. *Sith*
S. *Shuts*.
Begins with a fresh breeze from the S.E. heading
S. W. by S. under top sails, at 1 P.M. tacked to the
Eastward, Saw three sails, at sunset shortened
sails, middle & latter parts rainey, wore new Thy.
Sith sheets, wore ship to the S. W. Saw 4 sails,
So Ends, with squally weather, Lat. 25.18 S. Long 48.20 E

Friday December 14th 1860

S. *Almira*
S. *Brunswick*
B. *America*.
Sailed with a strong breeze from the S.E. and some
squally, heading S. W. under short sail, spoke the
America, *Almira* & *Brunswick* of Dartmouth
Baker Master, 12 months, 200 S. 100 whal Oil,
Saw the *Pamelia*, middle part strong wind,
latter part rugged, broke out between decks,
got out a cask of Bread, So Ends. Lat. 25.50 S. Long 48.58 E

Saturday, December 15th 1860

Rugged.
Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. heading S. S. W.
under all possible sail, middle part heading S. E.
& S. E. by S. latter part made sail heading S. E.
So Ends. no observations, Sun obscure,

Sunday, December 16th 1860

New Fore
top Sail
Braces.
Sailed with a fresh breeze from S.E. to S. S. E. heading
from S. S. W. to S. W. under all possible sails, wore
new Fore top Sail Braces, Saw a sail, middle
part brisk wind from S. E. latter moderate, made
all sail, So Ends, Lat. by Obs. 28.56. S. Long 49.57. E

New Holland, Augustus, N. Perkins, Master
Monday, December 17th 1860

All Sail.
Begins with a fresh breeze from S. E. to S. S. E. heading
from S. S. W. to S. W. under all sail, at 7 P.M. took
in the Fore top g. Sail, at daylight fine weather,
latter part heading S. E. by S. fitting Buckets, &
So Ends. Lat by Obs. 31.18. S. Long 51.20. East,

Tuesday, December 18th 1860

All Sail.
Sailed with a gentle breeze from the S. E. by S. and
fine weather, steering S. E. by S. under all sail, at 12 P.M.
unbent the Fore top gallant sail, middle & latter parts
fine weather, wind S. S. W. So Ends. Lat. 32.05 S. Long 51.00 E

Wednesday, December 19th 1860

F. J. G. Gard.
Begins with a light wind from S. S. W. and fine weather,
steered S. E. by S. under all sail that would draw,
middle part rainey, the wind hauled to S. S. W.
took in sail, at 8 P.M. furled the Fore sail &
sent down the F. J. G. Gard, heading S. S. E. blowing
strong So Ends. Lat 32.34 S. Long 54.58 East.

Thursday, December 20th 1860

Gale.
Sailed with a strong gale from the South & rugged,
heading to the S. S. E. under short sail, middle
& latter parts more moderate, made same sail,
So Ends. Lat. 32.12. South, no sights

Friday December 21st 1860

S. Breeze.
Begins with a strong breeze from the South, heading
S. S. E. under double reef S. middle part moderate
under all sail, heading from S. S. E. to S. S. E.,
Saw something spouting supposed they were
Blackfish, So Ends. Lat. 31.47 S. Long 57.17 E

Saturday December 22nd 1860

L. Airs.
All these 24 hours, light airs from S. S. E. and calm
made a Main Stay sail of the Old Sith, So Ends
Lat by Obs. 31.32. S. Longitude by the. 58.00. East

Sunday, December 23rd 1860

Calm.
All these 24 hours, light calm weather, heading
all ways, So Ends. Lat 31.38. S. Long 58.08. 30 E
