

Ship *Plower* of New Bedford, off Lt
 Thursday, January 17th 1861
B. America. Bore with a light air from the N.W. and fine
 weather, heading to the South under all sail,
 gammed with the *America*, at sunset took
 in sail, at day light made all sail, latter part
 more breeze, at 11.30. A.M. backed to the N.W.,
 the wind N. by S. So Ends Lat 39.12. S. Long 88.17 E

Fishing,
 at Amsterdam, Friday, January 18th 1861
 bore with a moderate breeze from the N.W. and
 fair weather, heading to the N.W. under
 all sail, at sunset shortened sail, at day light
 saw the land and made sail, at 12 noon sent
 three Boats in fishing So Ends. no observation.

Fishing,
 Saturday, January 19th 1861
 Begins with a moderate wind from the S.W.
 under all sail, at sunset the Boats returned
 with 80 fish. shortened sail, at day light made
 sail, unbent the Main sail & repaired it, at 11.30.
 the wind North North East sent two boats
 in fishing, So Ends, the *America* in fishing.

Rainy,
 Sunday, January 20th 1861
 bore with a light breeze from the N.W. &
 at 5.30. P.M. the Boats returned with 83 fish.
 at sunset shortened sail, heading East
 the *America* in company, at day light made
 sail, & last sight of Amsterdam. latter part
 rainy, the Barometer at 30.25, So Ends, no obs.

Breezy,
 Monday, January 21st 1861
 bore with a strong breeze from the East &
 rainy at 2. P.M. double reefed at 4. P.M. took
 in the Main sail Libb & Miz. top sail, at sunset
 took in the Fore sail, Fore top sail & close reefed
 the Main top sail, the Barometer at 29.08 tenth
 the ship heading S. by E. at 8. P.M. the Barometer 29.05 tenth
 at 9.30. the wind hauled to the South, blowing strong.
 at 6.30. A.M. heading West, wore ship and stowed
 S. & by E. saw the *America* So Ends under short sail.
 Lat by Obs. 38.33. S. Long 88.26. East. by Ther.

Pauls Isle, Augustus, N. Perkins, Master,
 Tuesday, January 22nd 1861
B. America. bore with a strong breeze from the S.W. and a rugged
 steering S. by E. under short sail, at day light made
 sail, at 11.46. unbent the Fore sail to repair it,
 the *America* in company, took out water flound.
 So Ends, more moderate, no observation

Wednesday, January 23rd 1861
B. America, Begins with a brisk breeze from the S.W. and a breezy
 weather, steering S. by E. Main top, 9. sail out, at 2 P.M.
 shortened sail, at 5. P.M. bent the Fore sail & set
 it, middle & latter parts fresh breeze saw two sails,
 the *America* in company, So Ends Lat 38.25. S. Long 84.27 E

Thursday, January 24th 1861
America bore with a brisk breeze from the S.W. to S.W.
 and breezy weather steering S. by E. under moderate
 sail, middle & latter parts moderate the *Burkin*
 company. So Ends. Lat 38.13. S. Long 86.56 East

Friday, January 25th 1861
B. America. All these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. &
 fine weather, steering S. by E. under moderate
 sail, gammed with the *America*, So Ends, Lat 38.25

Saturday, January 26th 1861
B. America. bore with a light breeze from the S.W. and fine
 weather, steering S. by E. under all sail, gammed
 with the *America*, at 8.30. parted company,
 middle & latter parts light wind from S. & W. to N.W.
 saw the *America*, So Ends. Lat 38.40. S. Long 89.41. East.

Sunday, January 27th 1861
L. Airs. All these 24 hours light air & calm heading different
 ways under all sail, saw the *America*, So Ends.
 Lat 38.17. S. Long 90.30. East.

Monday, January 28th 1861
L. Airs. All these 24 hours light winds from all parts
 under all sail, saw the *America* So Ends Lat 38.52 S
 Long 91.30. E
