weather got off some wood &c. so ends.

Wednesday, March 6th 1861
getting ready, Throughout these 24 hours light pleasant weather.
Employ in getting ready for sea. Sailed Bark Draco.

Thursday, March 7th 1861
getting ready for sea, All these 24 hours light pleasant weather,
got off some wood &c. so ends.

Friday, March 8th 1861
same with a light air from North, middle & latter
parts rainy, winds all around the compass.

Various Sols All these 24 hours light pleasant weather
doing various Sols so ends.

Sunday, March 10th 1861
fine weather, All these 24 hours light S. E. winds and fine

Monday, March 11th 1861
Oib, All these 24 hours fresh breeze from West S. W.
Sailed Bark Pamela, so ends. Sent on shore 2 galleys &c.

Tuesday, March 12th 1861
Shipping med. All these 24 hours fresh breeze from the S. E. W.
getting ready for sea, so ends.

Wednesday, March 13th 1861
Shipped 5 men, same with a fresh breeze from the N. E. W. and
quite rugged, middle & latter parts wind S. E. Shipped
5 men, so ends. all ready for sea.

Thursday, March 14th 1861
Under Way, same with a gentle breeze from the S. E. and
fine weather at 12, midnight all hands on board,
at 5 A. M. got under way for sea stowed the anchors
and put the chains below, the Ocean Rover in
company, so ends. Lat by observation 33. 18 S.

Friday, March 15th 1861
F. Breezes, same with a fresh breeze from the S. E. and
rugged, stowed N. W. under all sail, at sunset
took in the light sails, Main sail, Jib & spanker.
latter part strong breeze took in the Miz. top sail,
and double reefed the Fore & Main, so ends.
Lat by Obs 31. 47. S. Long 112. 52. East

Saturday, March 16th 1861
Boats crew watches, same with a strong breeze from the South &
rugged, stowing N. W. under short sail, at sunset
took in sail, huffed to the S. W. set Boats crew watches
at 2 P. M. stowed N. W. and made some sail, latter
part blowing strong so ends. Lat 31. 05
