Tuesday, May 7th 1861
S. Brewer, Comd. with a strong breeze from the S. E.
and rugged heading to the S. S. W. under
short sail, the Champion in sight, at sunset
were ship to the N. E. middle & latter part
rugged. So Ends. Latitude by Obs. 25. 42. S

Wednesday, May 8th 1861
Rugged, Comd. with a strong breeze from the S. E.
and rugged heading to the N. E. under
very short sail, at sunset were ship to
the S. S. W. at daylight made same sail.
Saw the Champion, at 8.30 steered West,
So Ends. Latitude by Obs. 25. 48. South

Thursday, May 9th 1861
B. Champion, Begins with a strong breeze from the S. E.
and misty weather, under short sail steering
West, at 3. P. M. spoke the Champion, and
put the Larboard Boat out, at sunset
took in sail, at daylight steered N. E. under
short sail, saw the Champion, So Ends. Lat 24. 57. S
latter part strong breeze, 108. 35. E

Friday, May 10th 1861
Rugged, Comd. with a strong breeze from S. E. and
rugged steering N. E. under two close reefed
top sails. at sunset took in the Fore top sail,
and heaved to the S. W. at daylight steered
N. E. under short sail. So Ends. Lat 24. 15. S.
Strong breeze

Saturday, May 11th 1861
Rugged, Begins with a strong breeze from the S. E.
and rugged, steered N. E. under short
sail, at 4. P. M. heaved to the S. W. and took
in the Fore top sail, at 9. A. M. steered
N. S. W. broke out meat, Butter, &c at 9. A. M.
steered N. W. latter part rugged, under close
reefed Fore & Main top sails & Fore sail.
So Ends. Lat by Obs. 24. 24. S. Long 109. 25. E.

Sunday, May 12th 1861
S. Brewer, Comd. with a strong breeze from the S. E.
and rugged, steering N. W. under short sails.
at sunset took in sail & heaved to the S. E.
at sunrise made sail & steered N. E. by N.
latter part more moderate, So Ends. Lat 23. 22. S. 107. 34. E

Monday, May 13th 1861
Miz. J. G. yard, Begins with a moderate breeze from the S. E.
and good weather, steered West, under all sail
meat, at sunset shortened sail, and heaved
to the S. S. W. at sunrise saw two sails. Made
all sail & steered West, sent up the Miz. top 9. P. M.
and bent the sail, at 11. A. M. spoke the Rose Pool
of Edgartown, Fisher, master, latter part raining.
So Ends no observation, the wind all around.

Tuesday, May 14th 1861
Rainy, Comd. with rainy weather, the wind from
all point of the compass, the ship under
top sails working to the W. S. W. at sunset
shortened sail heading to the South, at
daylight made all sail heading W. S. W. the
wind N. W. at 9. A. M. the wind South, steered
W. N. W. latter part squally around, So Ends.
Latitude by Observation 23. 39. South.

Wednesday, May 15th 1861
All Sails, Begins with a moderate breeze from the S. E.
and looking squally, under all sail, steering
West South West, at 1. P. M. took in the Miz
& gallant sails, at sunset shortened sail
at daylight made all sail & steered W. N. W. by
latter part wind light ^{from the South} So Ends. Lat 23. 35. S. 108. 57. E

Thursday, May 16th 1861
S. Brewer, Comd. with a fresh breeze from the S. E.
steered W. S. W. under top sails &c. at sunset
shortened sail, at daylight made sail,
steered N. W. latter part strong breeze. So Ends.
Latitude by Obs. 23. 18. South Long 105. 09. E
