Rugged,	Saturday, May 18 th 1861 Begins with a strong breeze & ruggeds heading S. W. under short sail, at sunset took in sail, at daylight wore ship to the S. E. & broke out Breeze, So Ends, with less wind. Lat by Obs. 23. 49. S. 103. 45. E	Thursday, May 23 rd 1861 All these 24 hours strong breezes & squally, under short sail, talked twice, shortened & made sail, saw Finbacks, & broke out water, So Ends, Lat 23. 09. S. Long 103. 15. E
Rugged,	Sunday, May 19 th 1861 bore, with a strong breeze from the E. S. E. & Rugged under close reefed top sails & courses, heading to the S. E. at sunset took in the courses & Miz. top sail, at daylight wore ship to the South, saw two sails, at 7. 30 steved off towards them, at 10. 10. luffed to the wind to the S. E. & set 11th & 12th, latter part more moderate, So Ends, Lat 23. 12. S. 103. 57	Friday May, 24 th 1861 bore, with strong trade & squally, heading to the S. E. W. under short sail, at sunset took in the Fore sail, & close reefed the Miz. Main top sails, at daylight set the Fore sail &c. latter part squally, So Ends, Lat 24. 32. S. 102. 50. E.
Barks, E. Dunbar B. Awashanks,	Monday, May 20 th 1861 Begins with a brisk wind from the S. E. & fair whale weather, steering N. E. & W. under double reefs &c. at 3. P. M. steved off for two sails & set main sail, at 4. P. M. spoke the Barks E. Dunbar & B. Awashanks, at sunset shortened sail, and stood to the S. W. at daylight wore to the N. E. and made sail, unbent the old Fore top sail & cut it up, strong breeze So Ends, Lat 23. 30. S. no sights.	Saturday, May 25 th 1861. Begins with strong trade & squally, heading South under short sail, saw a Brig heading to the N. E. at sunset shortened sail, at daylight wore ship to the S. E. & and set the Fore sail, latter part better weather broke out, meat &c. So Ends, Lat 24. 53. S. Long 102. 52. 30.
Old Sail,	Tuesday May 21 st 1861 bore, with a strong breeze from the S. E. under double reefs &c. at 1. P. M. spoke the B. Dunbar heading to the N. E. at 4. P. M. wore ship to the South & shortened sail, at daylight made sail, saw the Dunbar, latter part strong breeze, So Ends, Lat 22. 47. S. 103. 32. E.	Sunday, May 26 th 1861 All these 24 hours strong trade & ruggeds, heading East & S. E. W. under short sail, shortened & made sail according to the wind, So Ends Lat 24. 04. S. 103. 27
