

Ship Plover. of New Bedford. Cruising
Sunday, June 9th 1861

W. Sail. Land. with light trade and fine weather, under all sail steering N.W. under all sail, the Sava in sight, at sunset shortened sail, heading S.W. at daylight steered West, saw the Sava, so ends under all sail. Lat 24.15. S. Long 106.50. E.

Monday, June 10th 1861
Light Winds. All these 24 hours light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather, steering to the N.W. under all sail except at night when we shortened sail, and heaved to the wind, so ends. Lat 24.33. S. Long 105.05.00. E.

Tuesday, June 11th 1861
B. Sava. Land. with a moderate breeze from the N.W. heading to the S.E. under all sail, at 4 P.M. spoke the Sava, with 100. S. 250. W. at sunset shortened sail, heading S.W. at daylight made all sail except F & Miz F. G. Sails. steered N.E. latter part steered E. N.E. saw the Sava & lots of Finbacks, so ends. Lat 24.37. S.

Wednesday, June 13th 1861
Finbacks. Begins with a brisk wind from the N.W. steered various courses, at 2 P.M. lost sight of the Sava to the Eastward, at sunset took in sail heading N. by East, at daylight made sail. Saw Finbacks, latter part light winds. so ends. Lat 24.14. S. Long 106.48. East.

Thursday, June 13th 1861
Finbacks. Land. with a light breeze from N.W. and good weather, heading N. N.E. under all sail, at sunset shortened sail, & wore ship to the West at daylight made sail, & wore ship to the N. N.E. saw Finbacks so ends. Lat by observation 24.00. S. Long 106.30. E.

Friday, June 14th 1861
S. Winds. Land. with a brisk wind from N.W. to N.N.W. and good weather, heading N. N.E. to South, under all sail except F & Miz. F. G. Sails, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made all sail, saw new Fox T. M. S. Sail Halliards, latter part light N.W. winds, so ends. Lat 23.18. South, Recked the boat, and put Joseph Haggot in Cook.

Saturday, June 15th 1861
Sea watches. Begins with a light wind from N.W. and fine weather, heading to the N.E. under all sail, at 1 P.M. tacked to the West, at sunset took in the light sails and stood whole watches, middle & latter parts rigged, under double reefs. Sill & Mizzen top sail in. Saw a Finback so ends. Lat 23.56. S. Long 106.05.30

Sunday, June 16th 1861
S. breeze. Land. with a strong breeze from the S.W. and quite rugged, under double reefs & courses, heading to the West, at sunset shortened sail, at sunrise made sail, & steered N. N.W. latter part under all sail, so ends. Lat 23.27. S. Long 105.26.

Monday, June 17th 1861
Finbacks. Begins with a brisk wind from S. E. E. and fair weather under topsails hoisted Sill & spankers steering S.W. by W. at sunset shortened sail, heading S.W. by W. at daylight made sail, and steered N.W. by W. latter part light winds saw Finbacks, so ends. Lat 23.41. S. Long 103.42.

Tuesday, June 18th 1861
Finbacks. Land. with a brisk breeze from S. E. E. under top sails, heading S. W. by W. at sunset took in sail, at sunrise made sail & wore to the N.E. saw Finbacks, latter part wind light under all sail, so ends. Lat 22.57. Longitude by Chronometer 103.53. East
